<u>Veterans Career Readiness Program Syllabus</u>

The VCRP empowers student veterans at SJSU to earn meaningful internships/employment by providing monthly professional career workshops focusing on: military skills translation, career transition/exploration, career search tools, and mentoring/networking opportunities with veteran alumni.

Program Outcomes:

- 1. Students will gain the skills, knowledge, and understanding of not only the process of career exploration/transition, military skills translation, and fine-tuning marketing tools for their job search, but will be able to identify what their career goal is.
- 2. Provide guidance on obtaining a professional mentor.
- 3. Receive support to gain an internship in the student's field of choice.
- 4. Receive \$250.00* stipend upon completion of required activities.

Participant Expectations:

- 1. Attendance: Must attend **AT LEAST 6** out of 8 workshops* throughout the program to be eligible for stipend and <u>must be a matriculated enrolled student</u>.
- 2. Participation: Actively participate in your career exploration process by way of the workshop activities and complete required assignments.
- 3. Teamwork: Treat your cohort as you would someone you care about. Get to know their goals and keep an open eye out for opportunities and resources that could be helpful.
- 4. These are learning/working sessions-please be ready to work.
