- Group 2: Creation and Ratification of the Constitution

 - 9 States must be ratify, using specially
 - ¾ Clauses
 - Hamilton plan
 - Whiskey Rebellion
 - French Revolution (1789)
 - Alien and Sedition acts
 - McCulloch v. Maryland (1819)
- Group 3: Relations with Britain
 - Diplomatic humiliation by England- English allied with north- western Indians to prevent from US westward expansion
 - Shay’s Rebellion- fear of tyranny by majority
 - American revolution
 - Checks & Balances- ratification of the constitution- stronger Gov= protection from foreign tyranny
