



## Sample List of Events Commemorating the 50th Anniversary of the National Trails Act and the National Wild and Scenic Rivers Act

On October 2, 1968, President Lyndon Johnson signed the National Trails System Act and the Wild & Scenic Rivers Act, establishing the two systems. Since then, 11 national scenic trails, 19 national historic trails, and more than 1,200 national recreational trails have been created. More than 12,000 miles of American rivers are designated as Wild & Scenic. Criteria for designation vary, and elements of the systems are stewarded by a variety of federal, state, and local agencies and nonprofit organizations.
