We also heard from several guest speakers including the Provost (Britt Rios-Ellis), the Registrar (Tricia Westergaard), the Associate Provost for Faculty Affairs (Nivedita Mukherji), the Associate Provost for Quality Assurance and Accreditation (Kristin Landis-Piwowar), and our new CETL Director (Sarah Hosch). The themes of the retreat were: (1) developing and strengthening relationships (with admin, chairs/peers, faculty, and students); and (2) scheduling and successfully managing departments/programs while dealing with declining enrollment. It's my hope to continue connecting with these two themes, at least in part, as we move forward.
