Parents may choose any type of child care while participating in this program.

Parents who meet the income and work requirement for participation in the Certificate Program will be responsible for paying their child care provider a monthly co-payment fee. In addition, parents will be responsible for published tuitions rates. For example, if a parent has a child enrolled in AZQ Preschool and the preschool's published tuition rates are \$390 per month and the Child Care Certificate Program pays \$300 per month, the parent is responsible for paying the \$90 difference to the child care provider in addition to their monthly co-payment. **Priority Groups**

1. Referred clients

Referred Clients include parents served by TANF, TCC, Foster or Protective Services, Healthy Families Mississippi, or Homeless agencies. Eligibility for child care services for referred clients is determined by the referring agency which may include the appropriate MDHS Division or DECCD-approved community partners. Referred clients must comply with all requirements as set forth by the referring agency, and failure to do so will result in termination of child care certificates.

2. Special or at-risk populations

These clients include children with special needs, single parents with special needs, and parents deployed in the MS National Guard or Reserve. Parents at this priority level are served up to 85% of the State Median Income.

3. Very low-income, at risk of going on TANF

These clients include teen parents as well as parents who are working or in an approved educational program. In order to qualify for full-time child care, the parent must be working at least twenty-five (25) hours per week, or be enrolled full-time in an approved educational program. Documentation must be provided on a case by case basis. In a two-parent family, each parent must be working at least twenty-five (25) hours per week, and/or enrolled in school full time. The family's gross income must be at 50% or below the State Median Income.

4. Low-income, at risk of going on TANF

Based on the availability of funding, children of parent(s) in an approved full-time educational program and/or working the required twenty-five (25) hours per week whose income falls between 50% and 85% of the State Median Income.

The children whom we target are those aging out of foster care, children with special needs, sibling groups, and those who have been abandoned, neglected, and abused. MFFK provides an array of services around adoption, outreach and support services, development, training, parent education, and mental health. MFFK programs include:

Wendy's Wonderful Kids

This program seeks to dramatically increase the number of adoptions of children in North America waiting in foster care. We work closely with the child and the child's caseworker to gain first-hand knowledge to develop an effective, child-focused recruitment plan prioritizing the child's individual history, experiences, and needs in order to find the appropriate adoptive family.

Incredible Years DINA Therapeutic Program

This is an innovative program for children ages 3-5 designed to help children learn the appropriate ways to resolve common conflicts, promote appropriate classroom behaviors, and enhance positive social skills. This service is provided in an effort to treat potentially debilitating behaviors, reactions, and conduct before children begin elementary school. in doing so we implement a positive-based curriculum that encourages desirable behaviors in order to redirect the children.

Relatives Raising Other Children (ROC)

The ROC program is primarily led by grandparents and other relative caregivers who are ready for change as it relates to their needs being met to better care for the children in their homes. ROC includes Information to help in raising children, referrals to take care of basic needs, access to a clothes closet, assistance with school supplies, meet others that have similar experiences in caring for relatives, resources for meeting children's emotional and educational needs, and workshops on legal rights, custody issues, and visitation.

Rated (PG) Positive Girls

Rated Positive Girls is a unique preventative program for girls ages 9-12. Through open dialogue, training, and mentorship, the program is designed to develop young, impressionable adolescents into beautiful, happy, mature, and well-adjusted teenagers. The meetings include group discussions and presentations on adolescent development and other related topics. Monthly support group meetings are held at local community centers and at the local office. **REAL FLY Guys**

Realizing Excellence Among Leaders/ Future Leading Youth (REAL FLY) is a unique support group to enhance social skills in young boys. This group will help them construct positive choices in

decision-making. The goal of Fly Guys is to provide young male mentors to help young men have a better experience at school and home and to reduce emotional stress sometimes felt by children. REAL FLY Guys welcomes male mentors who are willing to consistently work with our youth.

Respite Care

Respite care is a temporary service that allows parents/guardians who care for a child with a developmental disability to have a break. Parents of children with special needs can burnout quickly from extreme daily caregiving required to take care of their child and family. Respite Care Services are provided 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and 365 days a year to parents of special needs children 0-21. Respite is limited to 20 hours per month per child for two consecutive months. Families can appoint a provider or choose an agency-appointed provider.

The Backpack Program

The Backpack Program helps meet the needs of hungry children by providing them with nutritious and easy-to-prepare food to take home on weekends and school vacations when other resources are not available. Backpacks contain enough food for six meals and two snacks: including protein and fruit juices.

How it Works

Teachers and school counselors identify students who would benefit from the Backpack Program. Then the food bank is given the number of children in need at the school. *The children's identities remain anonymous to the food bank, donors, and their peers.* With the help of volunteers, the food bank prepares the bags of food, which are placed discreetly in children's backpacks on Friday afternoons for them to take home over the weekend.

Help is available for those struggling to put food on the table. Those who qualify for SNAP include, persons who:

- work for low wages.
- are unemployed or work part-time.
- receive TANF, SSI or other assistance payments.
- are elderly or disabled and live on a small income.

Applications for SNAP benefits are available online in <u>English</u>, <u>En Español – Spanish</u>, or <u>Tiếng</u> <u>Việt – Vietnamese</u> or you may request an application by phone, in person, by fax, or by mail from your county office.

• Complete as much of your application as you can. Your name, address, and signature are necessary on the application for it to be accepted on the same day it is turned in, even if there is no interview on that day. Only one adult household member or authorized representative may sign the application for SNAP benefits under penalty of perjury.

• When your application has been turned in, the local county office will set up an interview to review your application.

At the time of your interview, bring verification of your income and expenses. If you cannot get all the information together by your interview date, come for the interview because you will have additional time to provide this information. If you need assistance in obtaining this information, please discuss this with your caseworker at the time of the interview. The following are examples of what to bring:

- Proof of identity (driver's license, etc.)
- Social Security Numbers for all household members.
- If employed, proof of income (wage stubs, earning statements, etc.) for the four weeks prior to your interview or last filed tax return if self-employed.
- Proof of residency (utility bills, rent/mortgage payments, lot rent, taxes)

To be eligible for the program, a woman, infant, or child must meet the income guidelines and be at medical or nutritional risk. Low iron levels in the blood (anemia), underweight,

overweight, or poor diet are typical examples. A nurse or nutritionist will determine if an applicant is eligible for the WIC program.

You can check your income against the current guidelines to see if you may qualify. Income eligibility can be found at the link below.

If you receive TANF, Food Stamps or Medicaid, you automatically meet WIC income guidelines.

USDA policy **requires** that applicants must apply in person for WIC benefits at their local WIC clinic. Parents not wanting to bring their newborns in to the WIC clinic have a 60-day period during which the newborn must be seen at the WIC clinic

Applicants must bring **proof of income, residence, and identification** to their WIC appointment. **Examples of proof of income:**

- A current pay stub less than 60 days old
- A signed statement from an employer indicating gross income earnings for a specified pay period
- Current W-2 forms
- An income tax return for the most current year
- Proof of Medicaid, TANF, or Food Stamps

Examples of proof of residence:

- Pieces of mail that include the client's current address (e.g., current utility bill, bank statement, etc.)
- A valid driver's license with the current address
- A mortgage/rental agreement

Examples of proof of identification:

- A valid driver license
- A social security card
- A valid U.S. passport
- A current shot record
- A military ID
- A newborn crib card

Mississippi Project START (Success Through Assistive Rehabilitative Technology) is the federally funded Assistive Technology Act Program for the State of Mississippi and operates under the Department of Health and Human Services' Administration of Community Living. The Mississippi Department of Rehabilitation Services is the lead agency for our program. Project START provided access to and the acquisition of Assistive Technology to Mississippians of all ages and all disabilities.

START'S Device Reutilization Program accepts donations of lightly used durable medical equipment. If you or someone you know have equipment you no longer need, you can donate it to Project START. The devices are refurbished to high-quality standards and provided free of charge to Mississippians with disabilities or chronic health care issues.

Project START's Computer Refurbishment Program provides in-home placement of refurbished computers for people with disabilities. The purpose of this program is to support education and vocational development as well as enhancement of personal independence for people with disabilities through the use of a computer.

Device Loan Program START provides a short-term equipment loan program allowing an individual to try a device before they purchase it. This program also allows an individual to borrow a device to use while theirs is being repaired or while funding is being secured for the purchase of their device. The loan period varies for each device but usually runs for 90 days. Project START's staff will work with everyone to make sure the right equipment is matched with the individual.

In addition to our state office location in Madison, Project START partners with North Mississippi Regional Center in Oxford, TK Martin Center in Starkville and Institute of Disability Studies in Long Beach.
