A Look Back: <u>How did we get to this opportune moment of billions in federal investments</u> for communities and the environment?



### **ENERGY**

The Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) invests \$369 billion dollars in clean energy, environmental justice, and climate to put the US on a path of 40% emission reductions by 2030.

# **Clean Energy Federal Funding Highlights**

- \$27 billion in the IRA towards the <u>Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF)</u>, to finance climate and clean energy projects that benefit low-income and disadvantaged communities. EPA will oversee the distribution of resources through GGRF, and is expected to open funding in early summer 2023. EPA is also distributing <u>billions more</u> in grants from IRA and IIJA provisions, including \$2.8B in Environmental & Climate Justice Block Grants.
- The IRA has appropriated \$11.7B in loans to clean energy projects through DOE's
  Loan Programs Office (LPO), expanding LPO's loan authority by \$100 billion. LPO's
  programs focus on providing loans to four main categories: commercializing innovative
  technologies, clean energy infrastructure, tribal energy development, and advanced
  technology vehicle manufacturing.

### **RURAL CLIMATE ACTION**

The IIJA, IRA, and <u>CHIPS</u> Act invests \$62 billion combined in rural infrastructure and climate action. \$19.5B from the IRA invests in farmers to lead regenerative agriculture and conservation initiatives. Currently, the 2023 Farm Bill is moving through Congress, and will determine funding for the next five years to critical food and farm programs.

Policy goals highlighted during the Briefing panel "Rural Climate Action - Federal Opportunities for Rural Self Determination:"

- Inclusion of the Justice for Black Farmers Act in the 2023 Farm Bill
- Eliminate matching funds in the 2023 Farm Bill
- Eliminating USDA's 3-year limit for new and beginning farmers, an additional barrier to sustaining agriculture in rural communities.

#### CONSERVATION

Billions of dollars in the IIJA and IRA are being appropriated to advance conservation and restoration initiatives. The Biden Administration's 30x30 goal sets a bar for using these funds to conserve 30% of domestic lands and waters by 2030. The <u>America the Beautiful Initiative</u> was launched by the administration in May 2021 to guide **locally-led conservation efforts** towards 30x30.

The <u>America the Beautiful for All Coalition</u> is advancing equity in the America the Beautiful Initiative and 30x30. The Coalition recently launched their <u>2023 policy agenda</u>. They invite EGA members to build power as a partner to advance a just vision of 30x30. Learn more about their <u>workgroups</u>.

#### **TRANSPORTATION**

Nearly \$700 billion of combined investments between the IIJA and IRA will directly impact US transportation infrastructure.

## **Transportation Funding Highlights**

- \$400.7 billion from the IRA and IIJA is allocated to driving-related transportation such as
  electrical vehicle (EV) production, constructing roadways, driving safer, and new fuel
  technology.
- \$150 billion in IIJA to transit and rail systems
- **\$27 billion** in IRA and IIJA to eighteen new programs reconsidering community design and local transportation
  - \$3 billion to reconnecting communities cut apart by highways through the Neighborhood Access and Equity Grants

#### **WATER**

The IIJA and IRA offer opportunities to scale up water infrastructure in the US. This is an opportunity to address water inequity and scarce water supply in drought-impacted communities. The IIJA delivers over \$50 billion to EPA to improve water infrastructure - the single largest investment in water by the federal government. The IRA provides an additional \$4 billion in drought relief, including \$550 million earmarked for national water programs to communities without reliable access to water; and \$12.5 million in emergency drought relief for tribes.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL EQUITY & JUSTICE**

The Justice40 Initiative was created by the Biden Administration to redress decades of underinvestment in disadvantaged communities. Justice40 is a federal goal to allocate 40 percent of benefits from federal investments to "disadvantaged communities that are marginalized, underserved, and overburdened by pollution." During this once-in-a-generation opportunity for communities to access billions in federal funds, we must hold the government accountable to equity and justice.
