

Ancient Tool Project

I went into the woods and I collected a sharp stone and a nice strong stick that is thick enough for the rock. First of all, I used a hammer rock to sharpen the rock to make it sharp like a spear, and then I used the sharp end of the rock to make a notch in the stick so the rock will fit in.
