Some of the things I learned was that she made 3 water tanks around the village so that when it rains it goes into a filter which then goes in the tank so it holds clean water for all the people in the village. But when it does not rain the water in the tank is only a couple inches high. Every few weeks the people in the village have to take all the water out and put it in cups so that they can clean it, because if the water sits for too long it can collect bacteria and get them sick. There are around 3,000 people in the village and they all work together to live. they eat together and work together. Leslie said her favorite part is how grateful they are. "I will continue this project for as long as I can" leslie murphy tells me. I admire how passionate she is for this fundraiser. Her fundraiser is called the Barry. A Murphy fund. She named it after her husband who sadly passed. They visited tanzania together and saw how bad things were and that's how it all started.
