#### Summer term

- -To know space travel is a significant historical achievement nationally and internationally.
- -To know the moon landing is a historical event which is in living memory of people today.
- -To know Yuri Gagarin (first person in space), Buzz Aldrin and Neil Armstrong (first people to land on the moon) were significant international figures in space exploration.
- -To know the first journey into space was a significant event in space travel that still continues today.

Summary: Significant people and their achievements (Florence Nightingale, Robert Peel, Yuri Gagarin, Buzz Aldrin, Neil Armstrong), Significant events (The great fire of London), Significant achievements (Space travel).

## Summer term

- -To know that Tamworth has change over time.
- -To know that changes over time have an impact on people's everyday lives, eg, homes, transport, shops.
- -To know that photographs and pictures from the past are a useful sources of evidence to find out about the past.
- -To know that comparing images of a place in the past and now is a good way to find changes and make comparisons.
- -To know that William MacGregor was a significant person who lived in Tamworth in the past.
- -To know that William Macgregor financed Tamworth's first hospital, built churches and gave land over to play areas. -To know that William
- -To know that William MacGregor fought for the rights of the poor and made positive changes to people's lives in Tamworth. -To know that our school has changed over time.

-To know that Cadbury world has changed over time from a factory to a tourist attraction.

## Summer term

- -To know that the Ancient Greek civilisation would be placed on a timeline -Before Christ (1000BC)
- -To know that the Ancient Greeks had many achievements which influenced the wider world, eg. Olympics, trial by jury, democracy.
- -To know that the first Olympic games were held in the time of the Ancient Greeks in Olympia.
- -To know that the lives of the rich and poor in Ancient Greece were different.
- -To know that Greek scholars contributed to our knowledge of the world. To know that many inventions from Ancient Greece have been developed further and continue to be used today, eg. early alarm clock.

Summary: Stone age, Bronze age, Iron age, Local historical study (Cadbury), John Cadbury, achievements and life of Ancient Greeks.

- -To know that Anglo-Saxons settled in kingdoms - these kingdoms later became the counties of Kent, Sussex, Wessex, Middlesex and East Anglia. -To know the features of Anglo-Saxon house and villages.
- -To know that the Viking invasion and the Anglo-Saxon defence of England led to many conflicts.
- -To know that the Vikings raided England for land and wealth.
- -To know that eventually the Anglo-Saxons defeated the Viking leaders, who agreed to be ruled by English Kings.
- -To know Alfred the great defended Britain against the Vikings and made peace with them.

Summary: Roman empire and its impact on Britain, Anglo-Saxons and Vikings, Significant historical figures (Julius Caesar, Boudicca)

# Summer term

- -To know that there were a number of monarchs during the Tudor period, including Queen Mary I, King Henry VIII and Queen Elizabeth I.
- -To know that some of the monarchs of the Tudor period were significant because they had an impact on a vast number of people.
- -To know the rule of monarchs in the Tudor period differs from today.
  -To know the individual beliefs of monarchs in history have caused them to take action e.g. religious change, exploration.

Summary: Transport development over time, Ancient Egypt, the changing power of monarchs in the Tudor period

- -To know that education for children changed positively in the Victorian era
- -To know that the change in education had an impact on children's lives during Victorian times.
- -To know that women protested for equal rights during Victorian times.
- -To know that crime was prevalent due to poverty and changes were made to the punishment system in Victorian times

#### Summer term

- -To know Mayan civilisation is an ancient civilisation in Mexico 1800 BC to 250 AD.
- -To know that the period of history in which the Classic Maya Civilisation occurred was significant due to architecture, maths, and agriculture.
- -To know what life was like in Ancient Mayas for different types of people.
- -To know that different sources represent different views about the same events.
- -To know that more than one source should be used to ensure that information gained is reliable.
- -To know some of the main features Maya society including religion, leaders and royalty.
