

STUDENT HEALTH INFORMATION

Life-Threatening Medical Condition

To ensure the safety and well-being of all students within our school community, we request that parents of students with life-threatening medical conditions <u>complete this</u> <u>form</u>. A life-threatening medical condition refers to any disease or disorder that poses a serious and immediate risk to a person's life or long-term health if not promptly and effectively treated. **This form must be completed annually** and is crucial for us to understand and accommodate the health needs of your student. Once this form is completed, the Dean's Office will reach out to discuss the development and implementation of a student medical plan. If you have any questions, please contact the Dean's Office.

Non-Life Threatening Medical Condition

If your student has a non-life-threatening medical condition, please <u>complete this form</u>. A non-life-threatening medical condition refers to any disease or disorder that, while not posing a serious and immediate risk to a person's life, can affect their day-to-day well-being and may require special accommodations or attention. **This form must be completed annually** and once completed, the Dean's Office may connect with you to discuss the need for a student medical plan. If you have any questions, please connect with the Dean's Office.

Prescribed Medication During School Hours

If your student needs to take prescribed medication during school hours, please download and <u>complete this form</u>. A licensed healthcare professional must sign this **document to be valid**. Once completed, please return to the Dean's Office.
