
AP Psychology Psychology 1 is not a pre-requisite

Why take it?

- Challenging and interesting

Who should take this course?

What to expect:

Do I need to take Psychology 1?

- No. I will start as if you know nothing about psychology
- If you have: Same content as psych but SIGNIFICANTLY more in depth and challenging

What is the homework load?

- Reading (from 2-4 days a week) (5-10ish pages)
- Homework of some kind most nights (likely reading notes, but could includes charts, diagrams, etc.) \Box the amount of time this takes varies by student
- Large volume of vocabulary you will need to memorize and apply

What are the tests like?

- Day 1: Multiple choice and vocabulary
- Day 2: Written
- All finals cumulative, some cumulative elements on unit exams
