DANGER ALONG THE OHIO / Patricia Willis

Traveling down the Ohio River in 1793, Amos, Clara, and Jonathan are separated from their father during a brutal Indian attack. The three children are swept down the river, and must make their way back through the wilderness in the direction of the Marietta settlement, hoping to find their father there.

GRAND CANYON: A TRAIL THROUGH TIME / Linda Vieira; Christopher Canyon, ill.

Walker and Company, NY, 1997. \$15.95 Grades 4-8.

Describes the deep trench known as the Grand Canyon, found in the Grand Canyon National Park, and the activities of visitors to the park.

HOLES / Louis Sachar

Frances Foster Books, 1998. \$16.00 Grades 4-8.

As further evidence of his family's bad fortune which they attribute to a curse on a distant relative, Stanley Yelnats is sent to a hellish correctional camp in the Texas desert where he finds his first real friend, a treasure, and a new sense of himself.

JUST JUICE / Karen Hesse

Realizing that her father's lack of work has endangered her family, nine-year-old Juice decides that she must return to school and learn to read in order to help their chances of surviving and keeping their house.

LONE WOLF / Kristine L. Franklin

When a large family moves into the house near where he and his father lives in the woods, Perry's friendship with the oldest girl helps him come to terms with his sister's death and his parent's divorce.

LOVE LETTERS / Arnold Adoff, Lisa Desimini, ill.

A collection of twenty poems written by kids and klutzes, secret admirers and detractors, friends, enemies, and skeptics to the objects of their affection-- or aversion.

MARY ON HORSEBACK: THREE MOUNTAIN STORIES / Rosemary Wells, Peter McCarty, ill.

Three very poignant vignettes brings to life the true story of Mary Breckenridge, the unforgettable founder of the Frontier Nursing Service, which since 1925 has provided medical services to rural Appalachian Kentucky.

After a very heavy snowfall in Florence, Italy, Sandro, the youngest page in the palazzo of Piero de' Medici, tries to find out why the ruler had summoned the sculptor, Michelangelo.

NAVAJO SUMMER / Jennifer Owings Dewey

This story of a young girl who runs away from home to live with a Navajo family is based on the author's childhood.

THE NEWEST AND COOLEST DINOSAURS / Philip J. Currie and Colleen O. Mastin; Jan

Learn what mighty monster was more gigantic than Tyrannosaurus rex and may possibly be the largest carnivore that ever lived. Was it a Sauropod's worst nightmare? Find out if you dare!

NORTH BY NIGHT: A STORY OF THE UNDERGROUND RAILROAD / Katherine Ayers

Presents the journal of a sixteen-year-old girl whose family operates a stop on the Underground Railroad.

PASSAGE TO FREEDOM: THE SUGIHARA STORY / Ken Mochizuki; Dom Lee, ill.

In 1940, five-year-old Hiroki Sugihara, the eldest son of the Japanese consul to Lithuania, saw from the consulate window hundreds of Jewish refugees from Poland. They had come to Hiroki's father with a desperate request: Could consul Sugihara write visas for them to escape the Nazi threat?

RAPTOR / Paul Zindel

Zack and his Ute Indian friend find themselves trapped in a cave with a living dinosaur.

SACRED FIRE / Nancy Wood; Frank Howell; ill.

Doubleday, 1998. \$25.00 Grades 4-8.

A collection of poems and paintings centered on the beliefs and ancestral wisdom of the Pueblo Indians of the American Southwest.

SMOKY MOUNTAIN ROSE / Alan Schroeder; Brad Sneed, ill.

Dial Books for Young Readers, 1997. \$14.99 Grades 4-8.

In this variation on the Cinderella story, based on the Charles Perrault version but set in the Smoky Mountains, Rose loses her glass slipper at a party given by the rich feller on the other side of the creek.

STANDING UP TO MR. O. / Claudia Mills

Farrar, Straus, and Giroux, NY, 1998. \$16.00 Grades 4-8.

Twelve-year-old Maggie comes to dread biology class because her favorite teacher is insisting that she dissect a worm, an assignment that makes her feel very squeamish and awakens her to the question of animal rights.

SUSANNAH / Janet Hickman

Greenwillow Books, NY, 1998. Grades 4-8.

After her mother's death, fourteen-year-old Susannah is taken by her father to live in a Shaker community in Ohio, but she does not find the same sense of peace there that he does.

WANDER / Susan Hart Lindquist

Delacorte Press, 1998. \$14.95 Grades 4-8.

Grieving for their dead mother, twelve-year-old James and his sister Sary find healing in their affection for a stray dog.

THE WILD BOY / Mordicai Gerstein

Frances Foster Books, Farrar, Straus, Giroux, NY, 1998. \$16.00 Grades 4-8.

Relates the story of a boy who grew up like a wild animal in the forests of France and was later captured and studied by doctors in Paris, but never became completely civilized.
