Subject: English		Topic: Proper nouns	Session length: 40min
Learning Objectives: To know that a proper noun is a special name and has a capital letter.	Possible Misconceptions: Pupils might confuse a common noun with a proper noun. "Why is boy not a proper noun but his name is?"		
Assessment Criteria (Success criteria) All will know that a proper noun is the name of a person and has a capital letter. Most will know that a proper noun is the name of a person, place, day of the week and month of the year and be able to give examples of that. A few will be able to separate proper nouns into who, when and where.	Solution: Explain that a name is special. There are lots of boys in the world and we can't use the word boy as a name. Key Vocabulary: Grammar, proper noun, common, noun punctuation, capital letters, full stops, spaces, sentences and question marks. Time	Structure and content of the lesson	
10min	<p><u>Oral/mental starter</u> Ask pupils if they can remind the class what a noun is. Explain that a proper noun is a special kind of noun. It is the name of a person, place or month of the year. Get them all to say their name in turn, then where they come from country/town, then what month they have their birthday in. Explain all the answers they gave were proper nouns.</p>	
20min	<p><u>Main activity</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Demonstrate what pupils will do. They must read together what their missions are and verbally give the answers to one another. ● They must make a table separating the proper nouns into who? Where? And when? ● Make sure they have written all their proper nouns with a capital letter and circle the capital letter. ● List 5 of your friends whom you would take with you on the mission. 	
10min	<p><u>Plenary</u> Go through the missions on page 10 asking pupils to provide answers.</p> <p>Ask pupils to turn to back of the book and tick the missions they completed.</p>	<p>Follow-up work/homework</p> <p>Complete designated missions depending on level of the child.</p>
