#### **AUDITION GUIDELINES**

The audition will consist of a comedic/dramatic monologue of the student's choice, which should be between **60-90 seconds**. Please try and keep your monologue within the time limit. PLEASE BRING A PRINTOUT OF YOUR

MONOLOGUE TO AUDITIONS. Do NOT read it off your phone. Longer does not necessarily mean better. If you have any questions regarding the general auditions, please see Mr. Calvert.

#### Auditions will take place in the Auditorium.

Students are required to come prepared to the audition with the <u>attached</u> <u>audition form completely filled out</u>. This will help with time management.

#### **SHOW SYNOPSIS:**

The hysterical meets the historical in this comic romp through the wackiest wax museum in history!

School's out for summer, but not for six unlucky students who don't know much about history — they have to retake the class in summer school. First year teacher Heather Fairchild has arranged for them to help her two aunts set up a new wax museum as a class project. Though the students' eyes glaze over with boredom, there's a twinkle in the wax figures' eyes when a mysterious incantation from the back of Cleopatra's bracelet brings them to life! King Henry VIII finds himself smitten with Cleopatra, making his queen, Anne Boleyn, furious. If she can just not lose her head, John Adams is there to serve as her divorce attorney! When Butch Cassidy, the Sundance Kid, Blackbeard and a bevy of lady pirates show up, everybody's out for one thing — treasure! Supposedly, there's a mighty valuable one hidden in the museum! It's a wild goose chase to find it, with a greedy museum landlord and her bumbling son joining in the mad search. And why is Lizzie Borden lurking in the

shadows since the aunts say they never had a wax figure of her?

\*All of the HISTORICAL CHARACTERS will be in full Make-Up and WIGS for the SHOW. Historical ACCURACY will be the expectation. Students MUST be willing to wear make-up and wigs for these characters.

### MATERIAL SELECTION

For the purpose of this show, please use a comedic/dramatic monologue (comedic preferred) from any printed play, NO ORIGINAL or FILM Materials. Once a monologue has been found, please analyze it for content, style, and subtext. Really try and understand the meaning of the text and discover the dramatic moments.

Avoid climactic material, which requires great explanation or emotional intensity. Remember your material must have emotional peaks that are used effectively and honestly. In addition, avoid dull and passive pieces that dwell on character or plot exposition. Your character should be actively involved in overcoming obstacles in order to fulfill an immediate objective or decision.

Think of your audition as a **11/2 minute** one act play entitled "The Audition of (your name)", arranged by, produced by, and starring yourself. Your audition should contain: 1) your entrance, 2) introduction of selection, 3) transition from yourself to character, 4) presentation of the selection, 5) transition back to yourself from character, and 6) a thank you.

#### **PRESENTATION**

Dress comfortably. Do not try to costume yourself, and avoid apparel that contradicts your character. Avoid hairstyles that might hide your face.

Plan to use just one chair, or nothing, in your staging. The focus should be on you, not the set design.

Make sure to bring a COPY of your monologue PRINTED out. Please do not read your monologue OFF your Phone.
