<p>Example: Humans are living things that can talk. For example, I am a human. Resources are things we use for different reasons. For example, people in my town use water to keep their lawns green and to bathe.</p>	<p>Example: Human beings rely on resources in order to survive. For example, in places such as the Western United States, a lack of water can lead to crops dying and even out of control forest fires.</p>

Examples might look like Venn Diagrams, flowcharts, concept maps, or other graphic organizers you have seen in class.
