WHAT IS A CREDIT? If a class has one course number it equals .5 credit and meets for half of the year (one semester). If a class has two course numbers it equals 1 credit and meets for the full year (two semesters).

(ex. Culinary Essentials 25080 is .5 credit and Introduction to Engineering Design 80250/80260 is 1 credit).

What is an Elective? Once a student has met the graduation requirement, a course is counted as an elective. For example, 3 credits of math are required for graduation. If a student takes math beyond the 3 required credits, then that credit will be counted in the elective category.

Champion: All students will have access to a curriculum to help bridge school and their individual future goals and aspirations. Students earn .25 credit per year for Champion. This credit will fall under the Electives category.

WORLD LANGUAGE: Taking a World Language is NOT required at NHS. However, if you choose to take a World Language course and have **successfully** completed a World Language course in middle school, then you are eligible to take Spanish 2, Chinese 2 or French 2.

Beginning with the Class of 2023, each Neenah High School graduate will be required to enroll in and complete at least one post-secondary credit yielding course prior to graduation. As we prepare graduates of Neenah Joint School District to be college and career ready, one critical experience is the completion of a post-secondary course prior to graduation. Students participating in these post-secondary course opportunities will experience the rigor and depth of college or technical college courses while receiving the support and guidance of Neenah High School staff and earning college credit. Post-secondary course opportunities would include dual credit technical college courses, AP® courses, and CAPP courses. It is understood that flexibility and accommodations may need to be provided to students based on learning needs, post-secondary and career goals.
