**Exemptions from Graduation Requirements:**

District students are required to complete the graduation course requirements specified above. Certain students may be eligible for exemption from local district graduation requirements that are beyond the state-minimum graduation credits under the provisions of AB167:

*A foster youth, homeless student, former juvenile court school student, child of a military family, or migrant student who transfers into the district or between district schools any time after completing the second year of high school, shall be exempted from any graduation requirements they are unable to reasonably complete (Education Code 51225.1).*
