

inuing the tradition By now most of you are aware of the turnover on

the executive board for the Boosters. Through current members not seeking re-election, board members resigning, and lack of participation overall every board seat is up for election this year.

We held our first of four regular quarterly meetings in January and we did not have enough turn out to fill the board. We discussed and decided to hold the elections at the April 6th meeting at 8:00 PM.

If at this time we do not receive enough candidates for the election to happen we will be forced to begin the process to dissolve the Franklin Athletic Boosters. The current board will finish the 2021-22 school year but will transfer all funds to the Franklin City Schools at the end of the school year.

The current executive board members along with Brian Bales met with Dr. Sander to inform the Franklin City Schools of this possibility and to start the discussion on how the team accounts will be handled.

What was discussed was that the money in the Boosters accounts would be transferred to the Athletic department and managed out of Brian's office. While there are still a lot of questions on how this will actually be administered our best guess is it will require more time and paperwork to obtain checks and or payments for team expenses.

We wanted to make this known to all of our coaches so you would not be blindsided by this potential change. If any of you know of parents willing to step up and become more involved with the boosters this would be a great time. The current officers would be here to help with the transition to a new board.
