## WEDDING DRESS ANECDOTE

Formally, weddings were often more a business association between families than a love match, so brides wore the richest fabrics and most striking colours they could afford to show their social standing, however that all changed on February 10, 1840.

On that date, 20 year old Queen Victoria wed Prince Albert of Saxe, in an iconic white silk-satin gown trimmed with lace. The white wedding dress was a real departure from the colourful gowns of the time but, Queen Victoria selected the colour purely because it was the best choice to showcase the lace detailing.

Another wedding protocol set by Queen Victoria relates to why white is reserved strictly for the bride and on the banned style list for wedding guests. Legend says Queen Victoria decreed no guests were permitted to wear white at her wedding, setting another wedding tradition which is followed still today.

Although Queen Victoria wasn't the first high profile royal bride to wear white, she is widely credited for starting the white dress trend and further proves the impact royal weddings have on wedding trends in general.
