Welcome to MomenToUs! I am Pastor Rebecca Grate, the Pastor Mission Developer for MomenToUs and the host for our weekly podcast.

At MomenToUs, we believe that God is present with us in each and every single one of our moments.

We believe that our stories are connected to God's story and to one another's stories.

We believe that this connection and relationship changes our lives and our entire world.

Before we begin, I invite you to take a deep breath in, hold it while you count to three, and then slowly release that breath.

MomenToUs launched 5 months and one day ago and our audience has grown to over 525 people connected through our social media accounts and we are averaging around 100 downloads of the podcast each week, with more and more people subscribing. That is amazing!



So, to those of you who are new to the MomenToUs community: Welcome! We are so glad you have joined us. You have joined us just in time for our new podcast season: Burning Questions.

The topics for this series are sourced directly from our community. Several months ago, just before we started our Sabbath Stop podcast series, we shared a question on our Facebook & Instagram stories: What confuses you about God, Christianity, the Church, or the Bible? We ran that poll every day for an entire week and every day the questions came flooding in.

One of our hopes and goals for MomenToUs is that this becomes a safe space for us to ask the questions that are weighing on us within a community of trust - even if we don't exactly know who is here and who is listening to the podcast alongside us. At the end of each of the podcasts for this series, you may say that you agree 100% with everything I am saying. You may say that you disagree 100% with everything I am saying. You may land somewhere in between. And all of those responses are okay. Questioning and wrestling with our answers is how we grow in our faith. It will be okay to disagree.

So, in no particular order, here are the questions submitted from the MomenToUs community:

- 1. Can the Church be involved in politics?
- 2. Why do Catholics and Lutherans have different Bibles?
- 3. I'm in my 20s. Why isn't there anyone else my age at church?
- 4. How do I know what God is calling me to do?
- 5. Why do some churches support the LGBTQIA2S+ community & others don't?
- 6. Why does the Bible contradict itself?
- 7. Why are there so many different types of Christians?
- 8. Is God still present with us or has God just left us to fend for ourselves?
- 9. When is The Rapture?
- 10. Why are Christians and The Church so mean to other cultures & faiths?
- 11. Why do some people get better after praying & others don't?
- 12.Can good Christians be in therapy?

There are some topics that might land closer to the questions in your heart than others, because they are questions that affect you or affect people you love. There may be questions that are too close and you can't listen to a podcast on a response to them. That is also okay. It is much more important for you to wrestle with these questions and answers in a way that promotes growing in your faith in a healthy way than to force yourself to listen to something because a pastor or someone else says you have to.

Every week, I'll give a heads up on what the question for the following podcast episode will be so that you can have a heads up. And, if there is someone you know who you think would love to listen to that particular podcast, you can give them a heads up to subscribe and download that particular episode.

I want to remind you all that our first in-person gathering will be on Saturday, September 23rd! We are going to gather at 10 AM (EST) at <u>Char</u> <u>Mar Ridge Park</u> in Westerville for One Step at a Time. We'll gather in the parking lot for some quick introductions and a short devotion before hiking. The trail is well maintained, but make sure you come prepared for path hiking, not paved road hiking. After our hike, we'll gather to pray for one another before we head on to the rest of our Saturday schedules. We have set up a Facebook event for this, so if you are following us on Facebook, please share the event on your pages and invite your friends to join us. We have had a few questions: Yes, you can bring the whole family with you! And, this trail does allow well-behaved and leashed dogs.
