# FamilySearch WIKI

The FamilySearch WIKI will teach you how to research.

#### What it is:

Family Search, a non-profit organization, created and maintains the FamilySearch WIKI as a free, online genealogical guide. The WIKI contains links to genealogy databases, websites, other resources, research strategies, and genealogical guidance to help in the search of your ancestors.

It will help you locate the best websites, find vital records, histories, census records, maps and much more. Free classes & videos, language helps and word lists. Maps, archives, unique collections such as newspapers, probate & land records, adoption, census, immigration, military for each area or time frame.

Available in different languages.

#### ♦ How does it work?

- You can search by place: The best approach is to search the WIKI for a place your ancestor was born, married, died, or lived.
- Navigate to a page: On the main place of the Wiki, click LIST OF ALL LOCALITIES. Find lists on online databases and other resources available for a location.
- Search by topic: Enter a type of record into the search field to find WIKI pages about the subject. For example, England

EXAMPLES:

United States North Dakota Sweden Census. Learn what the record is, what information it contains, and how to find and use the records.

## **Communities:**

There are online groups that allow you to ask genealogical questions and get help from other researchers. They can even translate or help reading handwritten documents.

Contains indexed, searchable information on soldiers and battles and photographs. Letters & diaries, manuscripts, memoirs, histories, and about women in social movements between 1600 and 2000.
