

DSLR FILM Noob podcast episode 77 show notes:



Gopro has posted its Q4 earnings and while profits are up by about 16% year over year, The end of 2015 say a pretty decent fall off.

Apparently GOPRO losing market share and laying off 7% of it's market share.

It' does seem like Action cameras have sort of reached full market saturation. While early Gopro's were a bit ahead of the curve they haven't really released anything that would drive people to move away from the Hero 4 or even older hero 3 black edition. To top that off, they've started to saturate the lower price market with \$130 offerings like the plain old "hero" and the Session dropped to \$199, how many more people can they find to buy action cams?

So "action cam rumors" site exists - first interesting post is \$399 Tom-Tom action camera - it has motion and heart rate sensors to try to detect exciting bits and creates a highlight video when you're done recording

Also new action cam with wrist remote... so seems the market is still there
