

2026 House bills that were defeated on March 12 because they were not voted on in time for the deadline:

CHILDREN AND FAMILY LAW

[HB 1377](#), allowing parents to make alternative caregiver arrangements for their children without transferring guardianship. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE & PUBLIC SAFETY

[CACR 19](#), relative to the personal possession of cannabis. Providing that adults 21 years of age or older shall have the right to possess a modest amount of cannabis intended for their personal consumption.

[HB 1408-FN](#), prohibiting public disclosure of personal information on the Internet by an elected official. Committee recommends OTP-A.

[HB 1034-FN](#), relative to possession of firearms on school property. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1049-FN](#), relative to storage requirements for firearms. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1084-FN](#), relative to the relinquishment of deadly weapons by those subject to a domestic violence protective order. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1142](#), relative to requirements for law enforcement officers assisting in immigration enforcement. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1235-FN](#), legalizing certain quantities of cannabis. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1302](#), relative to post-arrest photograph distribution by law enforcement officers. Committee recommends ITL.

[HB 1364-FN](#), requiring quarterly reports from counties, municipalities, or any other political subdivisions of the state that enter into certain agreements with the federal government concerning assistance with federal immigration enforcement.

EDUCATION FUNDING

[HR 40](#), urging the legislature to adequately fund public education. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

EDUCATION POLICY AND ADMINISTRATION

[HB 1212](#), establishing a commission to review draft rules related to minimum standards

for public school approval and state academic standards developed by the department of education. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP-A.

[HB 1280](#), establishing a commission to study public school open enrollment. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP-A.

[HB 1334](#), removing the authority of the education freedom accounts scholarship organization to make decisions about certain educational expenses. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1401](#), amending the meaning of scholarship organization as it pertains to education freedom accounts. Majority committee recommends referral for interim study. Minority committee recommends ITL.

[HB 1513](#), relative to reporting and transparency reports for the education freedom account program. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1804-FN](#), consolidating school administrative units, making chief school administrator jobs an elected position, and defining education roles. Majority committee recommends referral for interim study. Minority committee recommends ITL.

ELECTION LAW

[HB 1201](#), requiring certain political committees to disclose the identity of their donors. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP-A.

[HB 1223](#), relative to the moderator's authority to verify the device count during an election. Special ordered.

[HB 1277](#), relative to proof of identification on absentee ballot applications. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP-A.

[HB 1391](#), establishing a commission to study the implementation of a single ballot primary election. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends referral for interim study.

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENTS AND ADMINISTRATION

[CACR 26](#), the powers of the governor. the governor shall not call up the national guard without the approval of the executive council. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1180-FN](#), updating the definition of the state building code to include the International Energy Conservation Code 2024. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1320](#), establishing a study committee to analyze past, present, and potential funding sources for the New Hampshire state council on the arts. Majority committee

recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

FINANCE

[HB 1411-FN](#), directing the state treasurer to withhold payments owed by the state to the federal government where the state has been deprived of federal aid as a result of presidential executive order. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends referral for interim study.

[HB 1750-FN](#), making a supplemental appropriation to the department of health and human services for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

HEALTH, HUMAN SERVICES AND ELDERLY AFFAIRS

[HB 1316](#), restricting the collection and disclosure of autism-related data by state agencies. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1794-FN](#), directing the department of health and human services to identify the impact of Medicaid changes on New Hampshire residents' access to health care. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

HOUSING

[CACR 16](#), relating to property. Providing that individuals may sleep on property they own or have a legal right to occupy. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1008](#), relative to modifying innovative land use controls, requirements, and appeals. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP-A.

[HB 1017](#), relative to accessory dwelling units and workforce housing. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP-A.

[HB 1375](#), prohibiting landlords from charging more than one application fee per tenant every 12 months. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP-A.

[HB 1613-FN](#), directing the department of business and economic affairs to produce a report detailing methods to increase lending practices for housing developments that help persons with disabilities. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP-A.

JUDICIARY

[CACR 25](#), relative to the right to marry. Providing that the right to marry is a fundamental civil right and that the state shall protect the right of every individual, regardless of sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, or race, to marry and to have their marriage legally

recognized. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[CACR 29](#), Relating to the supreme court. Providing that the supreme court may not make rules that have the force and effect of law. Without recommendation.

[CACR 20](#), relating to the power of the supreme and superior courts. Providing that such power is repealed. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1389](#), relative to PFAS facility liability. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP-A.

[HB 1416](#), prohibits certain government regulations regarding pregnancy resource centers in connection with abortion and contraception service offerings. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP-A.

[HB 1456](#), repealing the legislature's declaration of authority over public education. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1590-FN](#), harmonizing the age of personhood under the criminal code and the fetal life protection act. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HB 1593-FN](#), relative to nondiscrimination due to disability. Majority committee recommends referral for interim study. Minority committee recommends OTP.

MUNICIPAL AND COUNTY GOVERNMENT

[HB 1383](#), relative to methods for overriding local tax caps. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

RESOURCES, RECREATION AND DEVELOPMENT

[HB 1258](#), relative to per and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) and public health data. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP-A.

SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY AND ENERGY

[HB 1745-FN](#), relative to the allocation of public utility costs to ratepayers. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP-A.

STATE-FEDERAL RELATIONS AND VETERANS AFFAIRS

[HCR 12](#), calling upon the federal delegation from New Hampshire to support Medicare for All, a universal health insurance program that guarantees all people the health care they need. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HR 34](#), declaring that Sharia law and political Islam represent an existential threat to the state and country and that any deference to Sharia law by a government institution is

prohibited. Majority committee recommends referral for interim study. Minority committee recommends OTP.

[HR 37](#), recognizing the United Nations universal declaration of human rights and urging the responsible and moral oversight of and accountability for military equipment used by international allies especially in Gaza. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

TRANSPORTATION

[HB 1165](#), relative to gender designation on state-issued identification. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.

WAYS AND MEANS

[HB 1708-FN](#), relative to statewide education property taxes and other tax revenues. Majority committee recommends ITL. Minority committee recommends OTP.
