Rosalind Wilson Reagan (b. February 6, 1945) is an American politician who is currently serving as the US Representative for Chesapeake's 1st District and Chair of the Committee on Social Concerns and the Judiciary. Prior to her career in politics, Reagan was an anti-discrimination lawyer who was primarily focused on cases of discrimination against transgender people. She also served as a trade unionist for the Chesapeake AFL-CIO Chapter from 2010 to 2021.

Reagan graduated as a Valedictorian from Millbrook High School in 1963 and went on to graduate from Harvard University with a Bachelor's Degree and a Juris Doctor at Yale Law School in 1967 and 1971, respectively.

In 1971, months following their graduation from Yale, Rosalind came out as transgender, adopting her current name. She then opened a law office in Fairfax, Chesapeake that

prioritized in anti-discrimination cases. Originally unsuccessful, as the gay rights and other LGBTQ+ rights movements gained popularity, Reagan's law office was recognized as an early supporter of the movements.

In 1974, Reagan illegally married former actor Jane Reagan, and the couple had 3 children together (Maureen, Christine, Michael). Due to Jane's disagreements with Reagan's political views (Jane was a fascist), the couple divorced 9 years later in 1983. In 1984, Reagan began dating Communist Party volunteer Nancy Reagan and, 2 years later, they illegally wed in Cheyenne, Lincoln. The couple had 2 more children, Patty and Ron.

In 1997, following a shortage in cases at her law office, Reagan wrote the book "Political Violence: Why it is Acceptable to Assault Republicans" in which she defended the attempted assassination of Ronald Reagan (no relation) and called for more assassination attempts on Republican politicians. The book was a New York Times Best Seller, but the information was suppressed by the CIA. 4 years later, in 2001, Reagan wrote the book "Kill Bush" in which she advocated for the overthrowal of the US Government and the establishment of a Socialist dictatorship. The book was never formally published.

In 2010, Reagan ditched law and became a trade unionist for AFL-CIO. In 2014, controversy was caused due to her assault of Republican Congressman Paul Ryan, then Chair of the House Budget Committee. They were charged with assaulting a Member of Congress, but the charges were dropped in 2015.

In 2021, Reagan ran for US House. They described their decision to run as a "turning point" in their life, saying that their desire to end white supremacy. They won their election with 53% of the vote, defeating Republican nominee Greejatus (who got 46%).

Following their election, they ran to serve as House Majority Leader, but lost the election to incumbent ItsZippy following his withdrawal from the Speaker race. Reagan alleges the election was rigged and that "the DNC conspired with Brihimia and Zippy to prevent outsider voices from gaining access to leadership"

Following his election as speaker, Brihimia appointed Reagan Chair of the House Committee on Social Concerns and the Judiciary. Reagan announced their intention to investigate alleged voter fraud conspiracies during the 2021 Presidential election between Democratic nominee Darthholo and Republican nominee and winner Ninjja Dragon.
