Non-BBCC Users Under 18 Years Old

Non-BBCC users under 18 years old must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian at all times when using the library.

In accordance with campus policy (AP7100) the library does not allow non-BBCC users under the age of 18 access to its facilities or services. Any user who appears to be under the age of 18 may be asked for either proof they are a registered BBCC student (current BBCC ID) or present a driver's license or other "official" form of ID stating their date of birth.

Many Running Start Students are under the age of 18. As registered BBCC students they do not fall under this policy.

Library policy <u>only</u> recognizes a parent or legal guardian as having the right to permit access to unfiltered internet access or any other library resource. Siblings or friends who are 18 do not fall under this category as they do not have legal jurisdiction over the potential user.

Any user not meeting the requirements of this policy must be asked to leave the library and campus. Users refusing to abide by the policy should be referred to the Library Director, if available. If the Director is not available library staff may contact Campus Security.

Under no circumstances should a user under the age of 18, be left by a parent or guardian in the library as this may make the library staff legally responsible for anything happening to the child. In the case of small children, library staff will attempt to contact a legal guardian, notify them of the college's policy and inform them they must immediately retrieve the child. If there is a refusal to comply or the library staff is unable to contact a legal guardian Campus Security will be notified immediately.
