When we praise God in a prayer of adoration, we say good things about God. "You are holy, you are mighty, etc."
- What do we call the most important days in the Church year? Feasts, memorials, or solemnities? (Solemnities)

- A prayer for forgiveness is called a prayer of ______. (Contrition)
- What saint is the father of the Blessed Mother? (St. Joachim)
- Tell three of the seven sorrows of Mary.
- When do we celebrate the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows? (Sept. 15)
