What is Dual Enrollment?

Per the Massachusetts Department of Higher Education, dual enrollment provides opportunities for high school students to take college-level courses for free or at a discounted price and earn credit toward high school completion and their future college degrees.

- Dual enrollment grades become a part of a student's permanent college record
- Dual enrollment courses may be accepted at colleges and universities (grade and credit policies vary by college)
- Typically a placement test is required to support eligibility for enrolling in a course
