Wednesday, May 13th, 3:30-4:30 p.m.






Is your kiddo on an IEP or 504? Our kids are, too! Join Inclusion Matters at these upcoming events this fall...

Did you know we offer a great online platform to follow your students lunch account? You can make payments and see what your child purchased. There is even an app! WBPS offers this as a convient, and secure online prepayment option which allows you to electronically deposit money into your students meal account. Charge Policy



Parents are responsible for making sure their child has funds for meals. WB's policy is to allow children to borrow for meals (breakfast and lunch) but not for a la carte or extra items (like cookies and ice cream).
