- <u>SEOG</u>: Trump budget eliminates funding for Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants.

<u>IES</u>: (<u>1st entry</u>) Institute of Education Sciences. This is the research arm of the DoE. Trump's plan is to cut their budget in half.

- <u>Libraries</u>: (<u>1st entry</u>) Trump signed an EO mandating the reduction of spending by the Institute of Museum and Library services.
- <u>Kim Sajet</u>: Director of the National Portrait Gallery; resigned after Trump called for her dismissal.
- <u>The Kennedy Center</u>: Trump fired all Biden appointees and named himself chair.
- <u>The Presidio Trust</u>: oversees Presidio of San Francisco National Park. Trump issues EO to eliminate it.
- <u>The Smithsonian Institution</u>: Trump EO on not funding programs with "improper ideology;" Trump tried to fire the director.

<u>CDC</u>: Centers for Disease Control. Program faces deep budget cuts under rescission authority. <u>2,400 have been fired</u>.

Community Block Grants: Trump's budget would eliminate these grants.

<u>Corporation for Public Broadcasting</u> (CPB): Slated for defunding and agency leadership firings. <u>NPR & PBS</u> (via CPB): Targeted for major funding cuts and board restructuring.

<u>Consumer Financial Protection Bureau</u>: Dozens of probationary workers fired with <u>plans to</u> fire hundreds more.

<u>CSB</u>: U.S. Chemical Safety and Hazard Investigation Board. <u>Trump calls for the elimination of</u> the CSB by October.

DHS: Over 400 hundred fired.

FDA: Program faces deep budget cuts under rescission authority. 3.500 have been fired.

<u>FEMA</u>: Planned phase-out post-hurricane season; staffing cuts.

Foreign Aid & Global Health (PEPFAR): Proposed \$8.3B in cuts to foreign health and aid.

<u>General Services Administration</u>: 1,000 workers fired. 2,100 workers have taken deferred resignations.

HHS: Health & Human Services. Hearings held over plans to cut 10,000 workers.

Department could not say how many have been fired.

HUD: Trump's budget would cut 33.6 B from programs.

<u>IES</u>: (2nd entry) Institute of Education Sciences. Trump's budget cuts more than half a billion from the budget. \$900 M contracts cancelled.

<u>IMLS</u>: (2nd entry) Institute of Museum and Library Services. <u>Budget cuts and layoffs</u>. <u>Trump plans to eliminate</u>.

IRS: has fired 7,000 workers. Trump's plan is to fire 30,000-40,000 workers.

<u>IobCorps</u>: Trump proposes eliminating the program.

<u>LFPA</u>: Local Food Purchase Assistance. Program faces deep budget cuts affecting school breakfast lunch programs.

Medicaid: Program faces deep budget cuts affecting services to the disabled.

NARA: National Archives and Records Administration. Trump making 3% cuts to staff.

NASA: Massive defunding and layoffs across science agencies.

NEA: (2nd entry)National Endowment for the Arts. <u>Budget cuts and layoffs</u>. <u>Trump plans to eliminate</u>.

<u>NEH</u>: (2nd entry)National Endowment for the Humanities. <u>Budget cuts and layoffs</u>. <u>Trump plans to eliminate</u>.

NIH: National Institutes of Health. Program faces deep budget cuts under rescission authority. 1,165 have been fired.

NIST: National Institute of Standards and Technology. Trump proposes a \$325 million budget cut.

NOAA: Massive defunding and layoffs across science agencies. Over 800 people have been fired due to budget cuts. This has left the National Weather Service scrambling to provide coverage. NSW is now hiring 100 employees to cover the 600 positions lost.

NPS: National Park Service. Reduces budget by \$1.2B. Plans to cut more than <u>5,500 jobs</u>.

NSF: National Science Foundation. Massive defunding and layoffs across science agencies.

Office of Personnel Management: Up to 250 workers were fired. The OPM will not confirm numbers.

Public Integrity Section: lost authority to initiate new cases. Staff has plunged from 30 to 5.

<u>Canada</u>: (1st entry) Trump <u>refuses to rule out military annexation</u> of Canada as 51st state.

<u>Trump threatens financial penalties if Canada doesn't become the 51st state.</u>

<u>Greenland</u>: Trump threatens to take Greenland by force. <u>Denmark concedes</u> to allow US military bases in Denmark.

<u>Panama</u>: Trump ordered military to plan invasion of Panama to regain control of the Panama Canal. This resulted in <u>Panama agreeing</u> to allow US military to operate from three bases in the country.

<u>Ukraine</u>: Trump paused aid and intelligence sharing; Trump considered deporting Ukrainian refugees.

Russia: Threatens sanctions over the war with Ukraine.

<u>Iran</u>: Threatens military strike if no nuclear deal made. He <u>repeats his warning</u> after Israeli strikes. <u>Trump orders strikes on Iran nuclear sites</u>.

Gaza region: Trump is working to forcibly remove 1,000,000 Palestinians from Gaza.

NATO Allies: Trump threatens not to defend allies if they don't "pay their fair share."

<u>Beyoncé / Springsteen / Bono / Oprah</u>: Suggested financial investigations into high-profile celebrities.

<u>Elon Musk</u>: Trump threatened to cancel SpaceX contracts. <u>Musk responded by</u> walking back some of his criticisms.

Kamala Harris: Trump suggested prosecuting Harris in campaign threats.

Media & Tech Executives

ABC News: Called for revoking ABC's broadcast license.

NBC / 60 Minutes: Sued network over how they edited an interview with Harris.

The Press, in general: FCC inquiries into media companies.

Others

Election Workers & Lawyers: Promised to prosecute those involved in 2020 certification.
