Your Tears & Dry Eye

Tear production plays an important role in preventing <u>dry eye</u>. Dry eyes can be triggered when something goes wrong with your tear production or the glands that create tears become inflamed.

Your tears are made of 3 layers:

- The oily outer layer
- The watery middle layer
- The inner mucus layer

Meibomian Gland Dysfunction & Dry Eye

Inflammation of the glands that line your eyelids can lead to <u>meibomian gland dysfunction</u> (MGD). MGD can reduce oil production in your tears, causing your tear film to evaporate too quickly and leading to dryness.

When MGD occurs, the oils that your meibomian glands produce can thicken and clog the glands, resulting in inflammation, eyelid irritation, and dry eye symptoms such as watery eyes, eye irritation, and a scratchy sensation.

We can help treat MGD through meibomian gland expression and other treatment methods, such as IPL. OptiLight uses precise pulses of light to reduce the inflammation that is typically associated with dry eye disease, improve tear break-up time, and increase meibomian gland functionality.

What to Expect During Your Dry Eye Assessment

Subjective tBUT Testing

<u>Tear film breakup time (tBUT) testing</u> is a diagnostic method used to evaluate the stability of the tear film in individuals with dry eye syndrome.

During tBUT testing, a dye is administered onto your eye's surface, and the length of time it takes for your tear film to destabilize is recorded. Testing tBUT helps our team examine your tear film quality and check for issues that may be causing your dry eye symptoms.

Schirmer's Test

<u>Schirmer's test</u> measures the amount of tears you're producing by placing a small strip of filter paper inside your lower eyelid. The paper absorbs tears over a specific period, usually around 5 minutes, and the length of wetting is measured.

This test helps determine if your eyes are producing enough tears to keep them adequately lubricated and moist.

Dye Testing & Staining

Dyes and staining techniques are commonly used in the assessment of dry eye. Fluorescein and lissamine green dyes are 2 common types used to evaluate the health of your eyes' surface, including your <u>cornea</u> and <u>conjunctiva</u>.

Who Can Get Dry Eye Disease?

Dry eye can affect anyone, regardless of age, gender, or race. However, certain <u>risk factors</u> may increase your chances of developing this condition, including:

- Spending a lot of time using digital screens
- Wearing contact lenses without proper care
- Using eye makeup daily
- Being 50 or older

Environmental factors can also play a part. People living in dry and windy places, like we do here in the desert, may be more likely to experience dryness and eye irritation due to environmental conditions.

BlephEx

Cataracts

<u>Cataracts</u> develop when the normally clear lens of the eye becomes clouded and can cause symptoms like blurry vision, dim or yellowed vision, and difficulty seeing at night. Cataracts begin developing when proteins in your eye form clumps that partially obscure your lens and stop light from reaching your retina, the thin layer of tissue that lines the back of your eye.

If cataracts progress to a later stage and prevent you from going about your daily activities, such as reading or driving, <u>cataract surgery</u> may be the only option to remove them.

 and damage the macula.

Diabetic Eye Disease

<u>Diabetes</u> can increase your risk of developing eye diseases such as glaucoma, cataracts, and <u>diabetic retinopathy</u>, which is a primary vision loss concern for patients with diabetes.

Diabetic retinopathy is a condition that causes damage to the blood vessels of the retina. Signs and symptoms of diabetic retinopathy can include:

- Black spots or holes in your vision
- A loss of central vision
- Blurry vision
- Difficulty seeing at night

We use optical coherence tomography (OCT) and retinal imaging in our <u>diabetic eye exams</u>⁴² to assist with the early detection of diabetic eye issues.

Chalazion

If you're dealing with a <u>chalazion</u>, commonly known as styes, we can help. A chalazionvoccurs when one of the tiny oil glands in your eyelid, called meibomian glands, becomes blocked. While it may initially be painful, a chalazion typically becomes painless over time.

Chalazia are more common in adults between the ages of 30 and 50, but they can also occur in children. It's often hard to distinguish between a chalazion and a stye, as both conditions result from blocked oil glands.

Diagnosing a chalazion typically involves a <u>comprehensive eye examination</u>⁴³, including a review of your health history and a thorough examination of the eye, eyelid, eyelashes, and oil glands.

Treatment options for chalazia include self-care measures like applying warm compresses to the affected eye multiple times a day and practicing good hygiene by avoiding eye makeup and touching the eyes.

- You're African American and age 50 or older
- You're Hispanic and age 65 or older

There are 2 common types of glaucoma. Each type has distinct differences that can affect your need for treatment.

Open-Angle Glaucoma

<u>Open-angle glaucoma</u> is the most common type of glaucoma, it occurs gradually when the eye does not drain fluid as well as it should. The tricky part is that it usually doesn't present any symptoms in the early stages, which is why regular eye exams are crucial for early detection.

This type of glaucoma is often painless and causes no changes in your vision at first.

Angle-Closure Glaucoma

<u>Angle-closure glaucoma</u> is a more immediate threat and can cause sudden and severe vision loss. Angle-closure glaucoma occurs when the drainage angle in your eye becomes blocked, causing fluid pressure to increase rapidly.

This sudden rise in pressure can lead to intense eye pain, blurred vision, and even nausea or vomiting. It's a serious condition that requires prompt medical attention from our team.

Managing Glaucoma

Eye pressure is not the only indicator of glaucoma, as high pressure does not always lead to glaucoma, and glaucoma can develop in spite of normal eye pressure. Anyone can develop glaucoma, although it can be more common for <u>people over 40</u>.

Some of the treatment options we offer at Desert Eye Associates include:

- Medications such as eye drops
- Lasers, in certain cases
- Surgery, which is usually the last step used to treat glaucoma

Contact lenses can be sorted into 2 main categories, soft contact lenses and rigid gas-permeable (RGP) lenses. Under these main categories are different types of contacts designed for different needs, such as scleral lenses and ortho-k lenses.

Soft lenses are made of flexible plastics that allow oxygen to pass through to the cornea, which can provide comfort throughout the day. RGP lenses are made of a harder, less flexible plastic, which can provide sharp vision and added durability.

Ortho-k Lenses

Orthokeratology, or ortho-k, is a nonsurgical procedure that uses specially designed contact lenses to gently and temporarily reshape the curvature of the cornea. This temporary reshaping provides an alternative way of correcting vision without the need for glasses or traditional contact lenses during the day.

Ortho-k lenses can provide numerous benefits, including improved vision without the need for glasses or daytime contact lenses, reduced risk of eye infections, and slowed myopia progression⁶⁴.

Scleral Lenses

Scleral contact lenses are larger than traditional contacts and rest on your sclera—the white part of your eyes. These lenses can provide extra space over your cornea's surface to improve breathability and create a fluid reservoir between your lens and cornea, which can help relieve dry eyes.

Scleral lenses can be an excellent option if traditional contact lenses aren't compatible with your eyes due to issues like dry eye⁶⁵ and keratoconus.

MiSight 1 Day Lenses

MiSight 1 day lenses are soft contact lenses that can help manage myopia 66 for children. MiSight lenses are designed to work by correcting nearsightedness while also slowing the progression of myopia at the same time. MiSight lenses incorporate correction zones that correct myopia in all gaze positions.

In addition to helping control myopia progression, MiSight lenses can provide numerous benefits, including clear vision without the need for glasses, convenience, and a design focused on comfort for kids.
