A short story about myself

I began my career in software development, studying Software Analysis and Development before deciding to switch to Computer Science for my final project. Throughout this time, I maintained a strong connection to business activities, as entrepreneurship was a fundamental part of my family's daily life.

Soon after starting my Computer Science studies, I realized that keeping up with the rapid pace of technological advancements made it challenging to create something profitable on my own. I knew that to succeed, I needed to work with others and expand my skill set.

This insight led me to establish a mobile-focused development agency through a commercial project. Although my first attempt didn't succeed, I later relaunched the agency independently, this time focusing on entertainment technologies for fairs and businesses. This venture was a success, and soon after, I partnered with others to expand it into a Digital Marketing Agency. Over the next seven years, I gained extensive experience managing the operational, strategic, and technological aspects of the business.

During this period, I recognized the importance of understanding our clients' business strategies, which allowed me to work with real business data, analyze outcomes, and refine my approach to strategy. This experience deepened my understanding of both technology and business.

My interest eventually shifted toward pursuing an independent path in tech-driven businesses. While I was certain blockchain would be central to my future, I knew I needed a solid strategy to establish myself in this field. Given the volatility of the blockchain market, I decided to start a backup business in the hospitality sector to support my transition.

Once I had a clear direction, I began engaging with the Cardano community, setting up nodes in Rust and helping others understand the protocol. Within a few months, I became a Cardano Ambassador and joined the first wave of operators on the initial test network.

As the COVID-19 pandemic put immense pressure on the hospitality sector, I decided to close my business and dedicate myself fully to Cardano. During this time, I closely observed the ecosystem's three pillars: the Cardano Foundation (CF), Emurgo, and IOHK. I also contributed as a Yoroi translator and engaged in ambassador activities, including content creation and community moderation. The launch of native assets on Cardano led to high demand for NFT development, and I implemented one of the first NFT minting projects, CardanoBeans, which performed smoothly under the demand.

As the Cardano community grew and new projects emerged, I found many opportunities to collaborate with different teams. With the mainnet and DeFi approaching, I wanted to deepen

my understanding of capital raising and liquidity offerings. I joined Occam to support people from other ecosystems interested in learning about Cardano and our tools.

Later, I was invited to contribute to Cardano Warriors, where I now actively shape the project's economic incentives, tokenomics, and operations. For the past two years, I've served as one of its three directors, helping guide the project's strategic direction.
