Google Classroom Terms for Students

<u>Assigned</u>—Work assigned by a teacher. Students should check for the due date.

Missing—Work not turned in.

<u>Turned in---Done late</u>—Work turned in late.

Turned in—Work that students turned in on time.

<u>Graded/Returned with Grade</u>—For graded work that has been returned, a grade or checkmark will be shown.


<u>Mark As Done</u>— If students are expected to complete assignments outside of Google Classroom, the student will see the **Mark As Done button**.

<u>Turn In</u>—If an assignment requires **student work** to be attached, attachments will be found above the **Turn In** button.


<u>Returned</u>—Work that a student must resubmit (A teacher will return the work to the student without a grade or feedback. Add a private comment and/or email the student to alert them about resubmitting).

Mark As Done vs. Turn In


If you are expected to complete assignments outside of Google Classroom, you will see the **Mark** As Done button.



If an assignment requires **you to attach work**, attachments will be found above the **Turn In** button. When you go to submit the assignment, select **TURN IN** (to mark as done).




The New To-Do List

On the Google Classroom homepage, select the folder to access the assignments you have completed (these are stored in Google Drive).




Submitting an Assignment
