Principal's Pen

Your children were amazing last week! They fell back into routines and were very academic. I am proud of them and their effort. Next week we begin our annual State exams. This is a great opportunity for our students to "show what they know". I think they will impress us!

Our PTA has two fundraisers left to save the Instructional Aides: Business Banners and the Jog-a-Thon. The Business Banners initiative involves leasing fence space on the perimeter of the school for business banners. Please watch for details on this new fundraiser. Perhaps your family business may want to make a contribution? The Jog-a-Thon will be on June 3rd.

Parents can help by getting pledges for their child. Recently Webster School had a Jog-a-Thon that earned over \$50K! MES can do the same, right?

As you know from my newsletters all year, we have a few important facility challenges at MES: mold in room 12, slip hazards on staircases, old public address system (PA), dilapidated handball courts, a clogged storm drain system, missing shade sails, no heat in the library, and a crumbling blacktop. I am pleased to share that the mold has been remediated. Drywall and carpet are on order and then our room 12 will be ready for use again. The staircases now have durable traction on them that should last decades. The conduit for the new PA system has been installed. Now the low voltage team is coming. The 2nd handball court has been fabricated and is ready to be painted and have flashing installed. The storm drains are cleared and I will monitor each one each fall and winter. The missing sail shade has been selected but I am unsure about an installation date. The blacktop is supposed to be replaced this summer. The new library heater damper flap was ordered last week. I will keep you and the School Site Council posted on our progress.

Beginning Monday, April 18 <u>all students</u> began arriving and departing from the Fernhill gate. Thank you for your cooperation with this change. Here are my observations and requests of parents. Observations: Arrival would improve if everyone came five minutes earlier. Most students arrive about 5 minutes before school starts. That is way too hectic and causes traffic backups on the street. Dismissal has averaged 12 minutes each day including Friday. Thursday was the worst at 15 minutes. Thursday is a music day for our 3rd-5th graders. The bulky musical instruments are cumbersome and slow the students down. At 12:45 on Friday we only had 4 students and one auto in the loading zone. **Requests of parents:** For drop off, **Come early**. We accept children at 7:45. At 8am we have virtually no students or autos at school. For pick up, use a name placard or visor card with your family name on it. **Come 5-10 minutes late and avoid the crush of dismissal.**

School Site Council Parent Elections

There are two vacant two-year seats for parents on our (2022-2023 & 2023-2024) School Site Council. We need parent-candidates to run for office. This is the single most important committee at school in steering school improvement goals. The committee consists of five parents, three teachers, one support staff member, & the principal. The principal helps the committee to analyze needs, set direction, and evaluate progress. The Board of Education sets expectations for the Site Council and establishes criteria for the approval of the School Improvement Plan (also known as the School Plan for Student Achievement / SPSA) and School Safety Plan (SSP).

This year's SPSA was finalized last May by last year's committee and constitutes a large number of the priorities for staff and principal. This year's SSP was finalized in January. Throughout the school year the committee reviews progress and discusses next steps. At the end of the year an assessment of progress and an adjustment or confirmation of goals occurs.

We meet on Thursdays once a month via Zoom from 3:30 - 4:45 and obviously some additional reading beyond meeting times will be needed in order to be an informed representative. Are you interested in running for office? Please complete this Official Candidate Form by Friday, April 29.
