- Usually a given
- Most thrillers feature a reset back to status quo
- most sci fi and fantasy reject this to keep change and move forward
- Check for pge 2 flashback disrupts flow by hooking on first page and then back to 3 days ago.
- Building the world and creating the world is the same as revealing the world, details through action and story that show characteristics of the world
- Readers have to engage with characters
- Use conflict, have character want something or forced into something
- Change in wants, evolution from what they want originally, maybe change to new want or else need
- Story starts at corner of want and need and can't
- If the only character changing is the protagonist... doing it wrong
- Bechdel test, Mako Mori test misuse of simple test re females in media, guidelines not rules
- Agency is the ability to make choices, have wants, pursue them
- Fridging of female character Green Arrow, end up dead to motivate hero, only purpose in life, female takes no part in her own death Gwen Stacy vs Jean Grey
 - o don't go there because we want you to have careers are writers Elizabeth Bear
- Cliches are your friends because you know where the reader's head is going and can screw with it - Steven Brust
- Bring something in that's new as well as the cliches and regurgitated tropes
- 3rd artist problem 1st artist is original source, 2nd artist is a reaction to it, 3rd artist just does it again
- Write what you like so you can connect with the right audience or it will lack passion and sincerity
- Write because something pissed you off, because you love something
- Start with wish fulfillment and then look at consequences
- It has been 1100 for the past thousand years, all of this magic and no one has progressed, wtf, bad fantasy or bad writing?
- Is it deliberate or laziness?
- Never say science doesn't work because that's saying indisputable laws don't exist

- o science doesn't care if you believe in it.
- Play with levels of science and tech justify why some exists and not others. Do research.
- Let characters be wrong
- Reality is unreal, there are people with skills outside the baseline, reality doesn't have to follow rules but fiction does
- Art and presentation vs reality
- Tiffany Problem Tiffany actually is a medieval name but it throws the reader out of your story, you have to pick your battles
 - ex popular names and variations of the same base names not accepted by readers as too confusing, ex Matt 1 and Matt 2, Two Stacys
- Why go to the duplicate trouble? In fiction, it needs a reason and justification
- YA is often a closed environment where you know everyone you look at

How does style change over time?

- Learn to trust your readers, trust yourself
- Telling too much, telling too little
- Style and voice
 - o style is the thing you can't leave out or help doing
 - o Gain more control over style, learn to go back and touch up
- Dialect, organization of words to hint at background
- Respectful to the group, regionalism done right
- Construct language based on the culture, world building profanity against the culture's dislikes, frog aliens who eat their babies have no swears based on reproduction, metaphors based on the culture, how they views the world
- Using swears as punctuation and with purpose, used as unconscious control ie not swearing in front of a lady is more keeping woman in place and not consideration
- Now that swearing is more common, it could be more impactful to leave it out, more nuanced
- Tell a lot about character by the words they use
