### **What is DELAC?**

The committee is composed of school staff, parents of English learner students, other parents and community members who are interested in English learner programs. At least 51 percent of the committee must be made up of parents of English learner students who are not employed by the district.

### **Advisory Duties**

The purpose of the DELAC is to advise, not govern, English learner services and programs offered by the district. As an advisory group, DELAC member duties include:

- Advise on the EL Master Plan for educational programs and services to English Learners.
- Advise and review a district-wide needs assessment on a school-by-school basis.
- Review and support district program goals and objectives for English Learner Services.
- Review annual language census.
- Review and comment on the district's reclassification procedures for English Learners.
- Review and comment on the written notifications to be sent to parents and guardians.
- Performing self-evaluation to determine if the DELAC is meeting its goals and appropriately representing the district's English Learners.

**The overall goal of the DELAC is to improve our English learners' acquisition of fluency in English and to help our students achieve academic success.**

### **DELAC Meetings**

All DELAC meetings, including subcommittees, are required by law to be open to the public. Meeting agendas must be posted in a public place a minimum of 72 hours in advance.

An ideal DELAC meeting agenda should include student achievement data, reclassification data, and discussion aimed to increase parental involvement. Items not listed on the agenda cannot be voted upon.

  - How do we support our English Learners?
- New on the Horizon: [Observation Protocol for Teachers of English Learners](#) (OPTEL)
  - The OPTEL is an observation protocol designed to support educators in monitoring and evaluating academic language use of EL students
  - Successful implementation of the OPTEL will help move California closer to statewide standardization of reclassification criteria required per Title III, Part A, Section 3111(b)(2)(A) of the Every Student Succeeds Act.
- The design of the OPTEL ensures:
- Ease of use by all (content area and specialized) teachers at all grade levels.
  - Teachers use the OPTEL to:

- Provide evidence that contributes to reclassification decisions for all English learners, including those with Individualized Education Plans
  - Evaluate student use of English while engaging in academic content learning, including interactive academic language use with peers
  - Assess language practices across a range of proficiency levels
  - Alignment with the English language development standards and the ELPAC performance levels.
- The OPTEL can also be used:
  - As a formative assessment tool in order to support student progress toward English proficiency
  - In consultation with parents of English learners regarding their progress toward proficiency
  - By institutions of higher education that prepare educators in teacher preparation programs
    - **November 2023:** Anticipate presenting the final analytic data set, validation study report, and draft OPTEL tool to the SBE with recommendation for approval as the statewide standardized protocol for Criterion 2 (teacher evaluation of EL students) and Criterion 3 (parent opinion and consultation) for the purpose of reclassification
    - **December 2023:** Final OPTEL implementation guidance documents, parent informational tools, and resources completed
