Montani for the St. Gregory Hymnal (1920.)

Week 3

- 1. Sing along to learn the second verse.
- 2. Even though this hymn is not about St. Imelda, it reminds me of her.
- 3. For younger children, print a Holy Communion coloring page
- 4. Work on copywork/verse illustrations.
