Introduction

It is considered essential that every pupil at Oswestry School wears the school uniform not only to appear smart in appearance but also to encourage a sense of pride in themselves and the School. In this regard, the School sets high standards.

The following code seeks to set out clearly and concisely what is and what is not permitted as part of the dress code. In doing so it lays down guidelines based on a desire to prevent extremes of style dictated by the vagaries of fashion, whilst not wishing to ask the pupils to conform to restrictions not grounded in common sense, decency and due regard to matters of health and safety. At the end of the day, the Headmaster remains the final arbiter of what is appropriate or otherwise.

To avoid embarrassment and unnecessary expense please consult the School before purchasing items of clothing where doubt may exist as to its suitability.

The school recognises the right of any member of the school community to wear a mark of religious conviction or of cultural heritage where this can be demonstrated to be genuine and not a matter of fashion or whim. The school reserves the right to ensure that religious and cultural markers do not conflict with its ethos, bring it into disrepute or compromise health and safety. Religious and cultural markers will be worn neatly and in accordance with the good judgement of the school.

All religious and cultural markers will be agreed in advance of their being worn in school by the Headmaster. The Headmaster will be the ultimate arbiter of what is acceptable or is not acceptable.

It is essential that all items, including footwear, are clearly labelled. Boarders should send spare nametapes to school.

Pupils who attend School without suitable uniform will be instructed to purchase the appropriate item immediately. Pupils may have the cost of purchases added to their school bill.

^{**} School trousers should be charcoal grey and of a conventional school style fit. This may include; tailored, suit style or straight designs. They must be made from trouser material and may not be cropped, leggings, skinny or stretch jersey material, etc.

^{**}Football/Rugby Boots - For rugby and football at school, pupils will need a pair of rugby or football boots suitable for both training and matches. Boots may have replaceable metal or metal/plastic studs or moulded rubber multi-stud soles, but all studs must be smooth, rounded and securely attached. For safety reasons, full plastic replaceable studs, studs or blades with sharp edges, burring or small tips and studs longer than 21mm or narrower than 10mm at the end are not permitted.

Sixth form

The emphasis of the dress code is one of business and all members of the Sixth Form are expected to present the school in a serious and business-like manner at all times.

For safety reasons, full plastic replaceable studs, studs or blades with sharp edges, burring, or small tips, and studs longer than 21 mm or narrower than 10 mm at the end are not permitted.

Mouth Guards - Must be worn for Rugby and Hockey. Available through your dentist or via school.

Additional Items

Pencil case - all senior school pupils should have with them a properly equipped pencil case for all lessons.

Laptop - pupils from all senior school year groups should bring a suitable device to School. This <u>FAQs</u> document has further detail. Year 3-6 pupils may bring a suitable device but are not expected to.

Aprons - pupils studying Art, D&T and Food subjects should be equipped with the appropriate school-issue aprons, a blue apron for Art and D&T and a red apron for Food (available from the school shop). Laboratory coats are provided by the School for science lessons. Pupils studying biology or chemistry at A-level will be advised by the teachers as to requirements.

^{**}For rugby and football at school, pupils will need a pair of rugby or football boots suitable for both training and matches. Boots may have replaceable metal or metal/plastic studs or moulded rubber multi-stud soles, but all studs must be smooth, rounded and securely attached.

Expectations and guidance for non-uniform days

These days are popular with pupils and are held to raise money for charities such as Children in Need, Comic Relief or other local, national and international charities nominated by our pupil body. They may follow a particular theme such as World Book Day or Christmas Jumper Day. Pupils may also be permitted to occasionally wear clothes other than uniform on certain school trips.

Whilst this allows pupils the opportunity to express themselves as individuals, it must be done so in an appropriate way. It is particularly important that any pupil dress on these occasions recognises that the school is still a working environment, and further that pupil dress does not give the wrong impression or cause embarrassment to staff, pupils and other members of the school community.

The following outlines our expectations that are to be met when pupils are not in school uniform:

Non-uniform day clothing is to be appropriate to the learning atmosphere

- If pupils (including male) wear t-shirts, they should cover shoulders, chest and upper arms.
- Shirts or tops must be worn at all times
- Skirts and dresses, if worn, should be no more than 6 cm above the knee
- Leggings, or shorts, if worn, must also be worn with a top that covers below the waistband of the leggings or shorts.
- Expectations regarding hair, jewellery and piercings remain the same only simple studs, one per ear, are acceptable.
- All usual lesson equipment and/or kit should be brought to school
- Usual values regarding make-up and nails apply
- Any tattoos should not be visible.

The following items should not be worn:

- Clothing with offensive logos
- Culturally offensive outfits or costumes
- Muscle vests
- See-through clothing, for example see-through tops or vests
- Strapless or 'string-strapped' tops
- Clothing which is revealing; for example, exposing bare midriffs, chests or décolletages
- Any rips or patches above the knee, on jeans
- Flip flops, sliders or backless shoes

It is recognised that the guidance above will not cover all issues that may arise, but we trust our pupils to make appropriate decisions about what to wear to school.

On the rare occasion that a pupil may decide to wear items which have not been covered by the above bullet points, but which are against the tenor of this guidance, a member of the Senior Leadership Team will use their professional judgement to make a decision about the appropriateness of the outfit. Should a pupil not be appropriately dressed, they will either be sent home to change (with permission from a parent/carer) by a member of the Senior Leadership Team, loaned suitable clothing by the school, or held back from participation until appropriate attire is brought into school by a parent/carer. In the case of a school trip, the pupil will not be allowed to attend and any contribution made for the trip will not be refunded.

Non-uniform days and activities are a valuable aspect of our provision and part of our community, and your support in upholding the ethos of Oswestry School is very much appreciated.
