It features activities like Cultural Mapping and Cultural Exchange Presentations, which promote identity exploration and language learning. Instructors will also learn to design writing assignments—such as personal narratives and bilingual family history projects—that encourage self-expression. By the end, participants will gain practical tools to foster inclusive, engaging classrooms that support both cultural appreciation and English acquisition.

Participants will explore how multisensory instruction aligns with NCCCS Adult Education Content Standards and identify embedded learning modes in sample lessons. Attendees will then choose between a reading/language or math breakout session (or attend both if scheduled consecutively). The reading/language session will use Scarborough's Reading Rope to illustrate how to target content standards through a structured approach to comprehension and word recognition, featuring multisensory and evidence-based strategies like spaced repetition. Both breakouts will include sample lessons and conclude with participants creating their own multisensory lesson plans.
