

President Donald J. Trump, a convicted felon, was inaugurated into office on Jan 19th, 2025. President Trump made countless promises during his campaign, and on Monday, January 20th, he held those promises true. Before he even ate lunch, Trump signed about 200 executive orders, some of which decimated the rights of immigrants and their children, ended the right to gender affirming care for inmates, and destroyed the environment.

Some of the most worrisome executive orders follow immigration. Trump has ended birthright citizenship to those born to non U.S. citizens. This breaks nearly 250 years of tradition and families coming from around the world to give birth on U.S. soil so that their child can have access to citizenship and a better life. This right is guaranteed under the 14th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. He has also signed executive orders to round up immigrants and deport them, even if they are in "places of safety," such as schools and places of worship. These places were previously off limits to ICE agents. In an elementary school in Chicago, as well as several other schools, ICE has already tried to take children out of their schools to deport them. Some are concerned about the workers that will be lost, creating even more of a worker shortage and crashing the economy. However, even more people are concerned about how many families will be torn apart, as parts of a family may be allowed to stay, while others will be torn away from the life they've built and the "freedom" they were promised in America. People also



wonder if Trump's wife Melania will be deported, as she came here on visa fraud. In all this fear though, there may be one shining light as a federal judge has temporarily blocked Trump's anti immigrant executive orders saying it is "unconstitutional."

Others, such as myself, are concerned about the rights of our LGBTQ friends and family. The U.S. government is poised to recognize only two biological sexes: male and female. This will not only be detrimental for the rights of trans and nonbianry people, but the rights of born intersex people as well. Intersex people are born on the line between female and male and don't fall into a definite binary. Even more, inmates will not be allowed gender affirming care anymore, despite it previously being labeled as life saving care. On inauguration day, the Trevor Hotline, an LGBTQ suicide hotline, had an increase in call volume by 33%. The day after the election, their call volume skyrocketed by 700%, 200% of which sighted political concerns as a reason for their call.

Another set of Trump's policies that we should be concerned about are ones concerning the environment. Trump pulled the United States out of the Paris climate agreement, which sought to reverse the effects of climate change, and keep our world healthier for future generations by cutting emissions. Trump has also made good on the promise to no longer restrict oil drilling in Alaska. The practice of oil drilling in Alaska will be detrimental to our environment, as more emissions



lead to melting glaciers, rising sea levels, and loss of habitats for nearly extinct animals. Not everyone realizes that our arctic friends are not only cute, but essential to their ecosystem and native culture. Polar bears are at the top of their food chain, eliminating their home, and therefore them, would destroy their food web. Polar bears are also important to native traditions, which have lived on for thousands of years.

One thing most people from all parties can agree on, is that demanding flags, that were previously at half mast for the death of former President Jimmy Carter, be raised for Trump's "big day." Trump claimed that it was disrespectful to himself that the flags were lowered, but he seemed to have forgotten the long and lasting impact that the former president had on the nation. Trump also said that "the left" seemed to be happy that the flags would be lowered during his inauguration. Most people did not even notice or care until he pointed it out.

Another one of Trump's new orders that has members of all parties in a stir is one in which he blocked federal aid across the country, cutting off billions of dollars that support hospitals, schools, and cities programs. A federal judge has temporarily blocked this order which halted the stopping of funding until February 3rd. This does not just affect Democrats, or the so-called other party, as many Trump supporters will claim. In fact, the most affected areas are likely red states, as they have a larger percentage of people living in poverty than most blue states.
