Arete Summer Programs Summer 2023

BRONX: Summer Bridge Academics

Serving approximately 200 middle school students at the Laboratory School of Finance and Technology each summer, Summer Bridge is an academic, social, and physically active five-week program that exposes students to opportunities they would not otherwise experience during the summer months. Middle school students in grades 7 and 8 participate daily (8 am - 12:30 pm, Monday-Friday) in a program focused on project-based instruction in reading, writing, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics), physical education, and team building. As the largest school-based summer program in the city, Areté Education and Laboratory School staff provide a model program offering high quality academic programming that positively impacts the academic, physical, and psychological well-being of children in Mott Haven. Summer Bridge Program runs for 5 hours (8 am - 1 pm): 30 minute breakfast (8 am), 4 hours academics (8:30 am - 12:30 pm), and 30 minute lunch (12:30 pm).

BRONX: College Bridge

Serving approximately 150 high school students at the Laboratory School of Finance and Technology each summer, College Bridge is a credit acceleration program for rising 9th graders who have the opportunity to take health, writing, and STEM courses for high school credit. College Bridge Program runs for 4 hours (8:30 am - 12:30 pm) each day for 6 weeks.

BRONX: Internships

The Arete Internship Program actively recruits high school students and recent graduates who are interested in pursuing careers in education and want to develop the prerequisite skills and experiences that will enhance their college applications and job resumes. The interns are trained to provide tutoring and mentoring services to middle schoolers and high schoolers during the Summer Bridge and College Bridge programs at The Laboratory School of Finance and Technology. The tutor and teacher assistant services are provided during the summer program. Each middle schooler who participates in the program is recommended by their teachers. Intern tutors and teaching assistants work alongside teachers during the academic classes: 8:30 am-12:30 pm daily.

HARLEM: Summer Rising

Serving 100 students (K-5) at P.S./I.S. 176 in Washington Heights, Summer Rising is a citywide program to provide free all-day programming to over 100,000 students during the summer in NYC DOE school buildings. The Summer Rising program includes academic, social emotional learning, and enrichment activities for elementary school students for 7 weeks during the summer (8 am - 6 pm). Arete staff collaborate with DOE certified teachers to provide morning academic instruction (M-Th) followed by afternoon enrichment (M-Th + all day on Fridays); students also have the opportunity to participate in field trips on Fridays and during the 7th week of program when academics have concluded.

CITYWIDE: Arete Summer Career Camps

Join Arete's network of professionals this summer to engage students ages 14-20 in an innovative career exposure and networking program: Arete Summer Career Camps. For three weeks in July, cohorts of 15 students will engage in hands-on work and service learning experience in one of three industries: journalism (July 10-14), finance (July 17-21), and teaching (July 24-28). Over the week, students will: 1) shadow one or more career mentors on-site; 2) generate industry-standard resumes, cover letters, and interview skills; and 3) present their learnings on the key skills and qualifications needed for entry-level positions within the industry. Program social highlights include: golfing clinic with finance mentors, designing and running an elementary school outdoor carnival, and New York media and journalism tour of the city. All current students and alumni of Arete programs are encouraged to apply to join one of the Summer Career Camp cohorts this summer.

Our Impact

- Arete provides students with 500 extra hours of academic and extracurricular
 experiences each year that provide access to books and computers, healthy meals,
 structured exercise, social emotional learning, paid internships, financial life skills,
 mentorship, and trips to cultural institutions.
- 100% of our students in high school graduate on-time.
- College access for high school students to AP courses, college credits (CLEP, College High School Bridge Program), one-on-one college mentoring, and work-based learning. Arete ensures on-time graduation with strong college placement and acceptance rates as profiled in the New York Daily News in 2021.
- Our flagship partner school, <u>The Laboratory School of Finance & Technology</u>, is <u>nationally ranked</u>; has a 4-year graduation rate of 100% and college and career readiness index of 87%; performs in the top 25% in NYC schools on state exams; 90% of high school students take AP courses and 60% of 8th graders receive high school credits.
- Our Social Emotional Learning program empowers students to be emotional intelligence ambassadors in our communities, teaching peers, families, and staff members about transformative life skills and the power of being smarter with feelings.

We get students into good colleges, good jobs, and healthy mindsets by closing the experience gap.

Where Areté Competes

We serve New York City communities, specifically the South Bronx (Mott Haven), Brooklyn North (Bed-Stuy & Brownsville), and Manhattan (Washington Heights). We partner with public NYCDOE schools, colleges, universities, and industry partners in education, finance, STEM, the arts, and health fields.

How Areté Wins

We serve students in primary and secondary public school partnerships, offering full-service youth programming in NYCDOE sites when schools are not in session (afterschool, Saturdays, school vacation, and summer). Our program model for younger youth centers on social emotional learning, individualized academics (tutoring and skilled literacy interventions), and enrichment (sports, career exposure, STEM, and the arts) and provides 500 additional hours of academics and enrichment each year.

For older youth ages 18-25, we work with colleges, universities, and industry partners to bridge the experience gap and place students in good jobs in education, finance, STEM, the arts, and health fields. We employ older youth at every level of our organization: as interns and program staff and as organizational leaders. We close the young adulthood experience gap through providing 500 hours each year of mentoring, networking, and career development skills through paid internships and job placement.
