**Please note: International students who have completed undergraduate studies abroad are welcome to apply to the Research Track, but we do not recommend applying to the Medical Track.*

- Term Selection
 - Select: Summer 2026 - Medical Track (starting Summer Session II on Monday, July 6, 2026)
OR
 - Select: Summer or Fall 2026 - Research Track (starting Summer Session II on Monday, July 6, 2026 or Fall semester on Monday, August 31, 2026)
- Biographical Information - complete these sections
- Personal Background - complete these sections
- Academic History
 - Add institution and upload unofficial transcripts for now

 - If unofficial transcripts are unavailable, official transcripts must be sent directly from the undergraduate institution to gsquest@umn.edu ([Graduate Admissions Office](#) in the Twin Cities)
- Employment - complete this section
- Test Scores - nothing to upload here
- Materials:
 - Personal Statement: Required - Please describe your motivation and passion for the field, highlighting your relevant academic and professional background, research or clinical experience, and personal qualities that reflect your core values. Share your career goals, vision for the future, and explain how they align with the Gateways program (maximum 500 words.)
 - Diversity Statement: Required - *Different than the Personal Statement*. Diversity of views and experiences is fundamental to the University's mission, and the University's faculty, staff and students share responsibility for the collective

achievement of this goal. Please describe the distinctive perspectives of life experiences, such as successfully overcoming obstacles or hardships, that you would bring to our graduate program. Describe how these perspectives or life experiences could contribute to the education and enhanced perspective of fellow students at the University of Minnesota (maximum 500 words.)

- Resume/CV: Required. Please, provide clear information about relevant items, including research, teaching, volunteering, and/or clinical experiences: dates, supervisors, roles. Make sure to include all research presentations, either posters or oral, at local, regional or national conferences or symposia.
- Research Description: Recommended - Briefly describe any past research experience, publications, presentations, accomplishments, and future research interests (maximum 500 words.)
- MCAT score - Required for Medical Track - upload either a previous official AAMC score or a recent free full-length practice exam, i.e. [Kaplan free MCAT Practice Test](#), or [MCAT Official Prep Practice Exam 1 \(Free\)](#)
- Recommendations: Required - 1 academic reference (we suggest providing at least two names, just in case your primary reference is out of the office and the deadline is soon.)
- Confirmation and Signature
 - No changes can be made to the application after submission. Contact us at gateways@d.umn.edu if you need to add or change materials.

After submitting the application, you will be prompted to submit payment.

- \$75 domestic applicants, \$95 international applicants

- *Before completing payment:* The Gateways MS Program has its own application fee waiver program available to all applicants who possess qualities and experiences that enhance the diversity of the intellectual, cultural, and social environment at the University of Minnesota. Please contact the program office at gateways@d.umn.edu to request the application.

The 2026-2027 application cycle will open on October 3, 2025. Applications are reviewed about once per month beginning January 2026 through the end of May 2026 by the Gateways Admissions Committee. The Recommended Deadline is Wednesday, April 15, 2026, and the Final Deadline is Monday, May 25, 2026. You will receive an email instructing you to log into the [University of Minnesota Graduate Application system](#) to view and/or accept your decision letter. Be sure to remember your username and password.

In extenuating circumstances, admitted applicants may request a deferral of their admission to graduate study for up to one year without reapplying. If the deferral is approved and the student does not start within the one year period, the applicant must reapply.
