Vocabulary:

Lesson 1

- Diaspora- Communities of Jews living outside of their homeland
- Exodus The escape of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt
- Judaism- A religion that developed more than 3,000 years ago in the Fertile Crescent
- Ten Commandments laws written by God and given to Moses on Mount Sinai
- **Abraham-** Biblical figure; God led Abraham to Canaan, and Abraham's descendants became the Jewish people
- Moses- a leader told by God to lead the Isrealites out of Egypt
- David- Jewish king who united all the tribes of Israel under one king
- **Solomon-** King of Israel; he formed alliances with nearby kingdoms and built a temple to God in Jerusalem

Lesson 2

- monotheism- The belief that there is only one God.
- **Torah-** The holy book of the Jews. Consists of the first five books of the Hebrew Bible and these are also the first five books of the Christian Old Testament.
- synagogue Jewish house of worship or meeting place.
- **Prophet-** person believe to be chosen by God to bring truth to the people
- Talmud- collection of oral teachings and commentaries about the Hebrew Bible and Jewish law
- Dead Sea Scrolls- writings about Jewish beliefs, created about 2,000 years ago

Lesson 3

- rabbi- Religious teachers in the Jewish faith.
- Zealots- radical Jews who supported rebellion against the Romans
- Passover- Jewish holiday that honors the freedom and exodus of the Israelites from Egypt
- High Holy Days- the two most sacred of all Jewish holidays—Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur
