Dear Families of San Lorenzo Unified School District,

This letter is to inform you that your child's class will soon be starting a unit on Family Life Education as part of the health education curriculum. It will be taught by your child's teacher for 5 grade and the 7th-grade science teacher for middle school. By teaching children about the ways they are developing and maturing, adults promote a positive attitude toward sexuality that helps children grow into healthy and responsible adults.

The comprehensive sexuality education unit requires the following topics: puberty, menstruation, reproductive systems, communication skills, making healthy choices, dealing with peer pressure, analyzing media influences for sexual messages, promoting healthy behavior, healthy relationships, and refusal skills. In addition, for 7th grade, the <u>California Youth Act of 2016</u> requires all school districts to ensure that all pupils in grades 7-12 receive comprehensive sexual health education and HIV prevention and education.

The curriculum and materials used to teach Family Life Education are the following:

5*grade: Puberty: the Wonder Years, by Wendy Sellers

7th grade: Positive Prevention+, 2018 edition

The curriculum offers current and relevant information and provides the latest research and best practices for teaching children about these important topics. These materials were reviewed by teachers and parents and are available for review at the school site. They are also available for review at the district office, Educational Services Department. Please call your child's school if you want to review the materials.

Your child will be encouraged to talk to you about growing up. Interviews with a parent or another trusted adult will be assigned as homework in order to promote open communication.

If you **do not** wish your child to participate in Family Life Education, please write a letter asking that your child be excused from participating in the unit and return it to your child's teacher by Tuesday, April 15, 2025. If you decide that your child should not participate in some or all of the lessons, they will be excused without penalty. Please do not hesitate to contact your teacher, principal, or district office if you have any questions.

Our CSUEB Field trip is this MONDAY!!! Student MUST be on time as we will leave promptly at 8:45! Also, students need to carry their own lunch whether they bring it from home or getting their lunch from the school cafeteria. So, a small bag to carry their lunch hands free.

Details are below and please consider talking with your student about appropriate behavior.

On the way to CSUEB we will take 3 different busses. The first one #35 goes to Bay Fair Bart. The second #10 goes to Hayward Bart. And the last #60 will take us to CSUEB.

On the way back, we will take 2 different busses. The first is #60 to Hayward Bart and #34 to Farnsworth/Fargo Ave.

There is a very high chance that we will have to stand on the bus if it is full and the wait time between buses may be up to 15-20 minutes. Students have been instructed to not engage with strangers and to give up their seats to those that need them more.

We will have lunch roughly around 11am. CSUEB is a cashless campus and so students will need to bring their own lunch or a school lunch and a drink. The forecast right now shows there's a 60% chance of rain, but it looks like the rain stops before school starts.

Chaperones will hold onto their groups' AC Transit Day Passes. There will be 5 groups with 4-5 kids in each. My group will always be in the front. Coach Weller or Ms. Wakeman's group should be in the rear. We will have a school tour led by CSUEB Student Ambassadors. They have tailored their tour for elementary school students. We will be back by 1pm.
