Welcome:

Chirstine called the meeting to order the meeting in Paducah KY and welcomed all!

Opening Announcements:

Christine reminded us that NOW is a multi-issue, multi-strategy organization that takes a holistic approach to women's rights. Our priorities are winning economic equality and securing it with an amendment to the U.S. Constitution that will guarantee equal rights for women; championing abortion rights, reproductive freedom and other women's health issues; opposing racism; fighting bigotry against the LGBTQIA community; and ending violence against women.

Introductions allowed Paducah members to meet Murray members and discuss what events gave them their feminist voice. We had a small Paducah turnout and will continue to reach out to all members.

Christine discussed that we have several members that are interested in being on the leadership team and representing the young feminist (under 35 years old). As stated in the July minutes, this will be formalized by the current leadership team to be presented to the members in the September 2025 meeting

- The National conference appeared to have a lot of difficulties to the point that the counting of the voting for new President and VP was initially halted. The elections results were subsequently approved by national board with Kim Villanueva as president and Rose Brunache as vice president
- It was noted that there is confusion regarding membership dues. As we understand, \$35 dues are paid to National; they keep \$10 and provide \$25 to the local chapter.
- We are a local WKY chapter under the leadership of the KY State NOW, in the Southern District.
