

## Article XX. International/Immigrant Scholar Rights and Support

### Section 1. Visa and immigration options

- A. The Employer shall~~may~~ offer all International employees all eligible visa categories, as long as they meet Department of Homeland Security and United States Citizenship and Immigration Services regulations. The Employer shall include information about visa sponsorship in any job listings of bargaining unit positions.
- B. The Employer and the Union shall co-host ~~quarterly~~ annual workshops with immigration attorneys on visa and immigration options for employees. The Employer and the Union will equally share the cost of attorney fees for these workshops.

### Section 2. Visa Fees

- ~~A. The Employer, Department, Program or Unit shall pay or reimburse all fees for visa sponsoring and processing and not pass on the costs to the employee. The University shall pay Visa Processing Fees and Expenses for the employees it sponsors.~~
- B. The Employer will strongly encourage units to request the ~~The Employer shall pay the~~ Premium Processing Fee option for all work authorization applications.

### ~~Section 3. Employer Sponsorship of Employment-Based Permanent Residency Applications~~

- ~~A. Employees shall be eligible to apply for Employer sponsorship of an employment-based permanent residency application.~~
- ~~B. The Employer shall pay all fees associated with an employment based permanent residency application including but not limited to filing fees and legal assistance.~~

### Section ~~3~~4. Maintaining Immigration Status

- A. The Employer shall provide information and guidance to employees who are attaining a new visa ~~or permanent residency status~~ or modifying their existing visa or status.
- B. The Employer will make a good faith effort to process visa paperwork in the control of the Employer in a timely manner.
  - a. If delays in processing the visa paperwork in the control of the Employer results in additional expenses or financial losses to the employee, the Employer shall make the employee whole including but not limited to payment of lost wages and travel.

### Section ~~4~~5. International Grievants Who Are Dismissed

- A. If the grievant was required to leave the country prior to the arbitration hearing due to a change in visa status as a result of the grieved action, but elects to participate in person on a travel visa, upon request the Employer will assist in obtaining the travel visa by providing the form letter in Attachment A.
- B. If the arbitrator makes the determination that the grievant was not dismissed for just cause, the employing unit shall reimburse for actual travel costs incurred, for the grievant only, to appear at the hearing. Such reimbursement by the employing unit shall be limited to a travel visa and airfare, in accordance with Employer Travel Policy.
- C. If the arbitrator upholds the dismissal, the Union shall be responsible for reimbursement of travel costs to the grievant.

Section 56. Paid Leave for Visa and Immigration Proceedings and Appointments

- A. ~~The Employer shall provide 5 days of paid leave per year in order for the employee~~  
Employees may use available time off balances to attend visa and immigration proceedings and biometrics appointments for the employee and their family.
