¿De dónde...? And Ser de...

In order to ask where someone is from, Spanish uses ¿de dónde...? And a form of ser.

¿ De dónde es usted? Where are you from?

In order to say where someone is from, Spanish uses **Ser + de + place**

Soy de San Francisco
¿María? Es de México María?

I am from San Francisco
She is from Mexico

The names of countries in Spanish, as in English, are always capitalized. Sometimes the definite article is used with certain countries, although the tendency is to not use it. You should, however, recognize it if you hear or see it used with these countries:

la Argentina el Paraguay el Brasil el Perú el Ecuador el Uruguay

los Estados Unidos

The definite article is always used with El Salvador, because it is part of the country's name, and with La República Dominicana.
