

## **Submission Guideline for Articles**

Any article or manuscript submitted to the Cambodia University of Technology and Science (CamTech) must be an original work and should NOT be under consideration for publication elsewhere. In addition, articles or manuscripts will not be considered if they do not conform to our submission guidelines. Therefore, please read the guidelines thoroughly.

### **CamTech Correspondence**

CamTech Correspondence articles are op-ed articles, commentaries, or short articles that reanalyze published articles or present findings or discuss issues of particular interest to the community. Papers submitted to CamTech Correspondence are considered at the discretion of the editor and may be edited for clarity or length, but may or may not be subject to a peer-review process. Full paper submission should not exceed 1000 words in length, including footnotes, endnotes, tables, figures, and bibliography. The articles may be edited for clarity or length and may be subject to peer review at the editor's decision.

### **Science Technology and Sustainability Review (ISSN: xxxx-xxxx)**

CamTech Science Technology and Sustainability Review (STSR) is connected primarily with the analysis of currently specific social, economic, scientific, and technological development issues and challenges for Cambodia and beyond. It attempts to fill a gap between the interested general public and the academics and is designed to help researchers in both social and pure science keep abreast of the vast flow of academic literature. Therefore, STSR aims to publish papers that is widely accessible and will serve several goals: to synthesize and integrate central ideas from state-of-the-art literature thinking; to provide knowledge and reading materials for university-level classroom use, to stimulate cross-fertilization of ideas among academics from various field, and to ask remaining unanswered questions and suggest direction for future research. STSR articles should be comprised less than 3000 words. STSR is subject to a double-blind peer reviewing process.

### **General Format**

Manuscript should be compiled in the following order: title/cover page; acknowledgement; main body of text; references; appendices (if any); table(s); table(s) and figure(s) (on individual pages).

Manuscript should be formatted for standard A4 paper, with 2.254 cm (1-inch) margins on all sides.

Manuscript should be typed as a Word document, using Times New Roman, size 12 pt, with double spacing. This applies to main content and bibliography. LaTeX document with default font and size (Computer Modern, 10 pt) and 'article' class is also accepted.

Submission should be of a high standard of English. Spelling can be either British or American English so long as the usage is consistent.

Original spelling should be retained for quoted text or speech.

### **Cover Page**

Cover page should be separated from the main body of the manuscript and should contain only the title of the article, the author's name, and the author's affiliation in the center of the page.

Do not list authors' academic degree (e.g. Ph.D) or (e.g. H.E.).

### **Acknowledgement**

Anyone who contributed to the manuscript or article but does not meet the criteria for authorship should be acknowledge. However, authors should obtain permission to acknowledge from all those mentioned in the acknowledgements section.

All sources of funding for the research should also be declared in the acknowledgement.

If no one or source of funding is to be acknowledgement, please write "Not applicable" in this session.

### **In-text Citation and Bibliography**

Authors are required to follow the American Psychological Association (APA) 6<sup>th</sup> style for both in-text citations and bibliography. For more details on the APA 6<sup>th</sup> style, please consult the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (6<sup>th</sup> edition).

Authors have to ensure that every in-text citation has its own reference in the bibliography.

### **Formula, Table, Figure, and Illustrations**

Table, figure, or image should be numbered and have captions and source. They should be placed at the end of the manuscript rather than in the body of the text.

If such materials are copyrighted, authors are responsible for obtaining and supplying written evidence of permission from copyright holders for reproducing purposes.
