THE ROSKARNIAN PUBLIC SECURITY & DEFENSE STRUCTURE (Public Defense Force)

“Strength, Supremacy, Discipline.”

“For the purposes of this Article, ‘Public Defense Forces (PDF)’ refers to constitutionally-mandated public security and civil defense institutions operating under civilian authority, and does not denote reserve or wartime military formations.”

PDF also as a reserve force

- Every citizen is already trained for disasters, crowd management, and emergencies
- They’re a latent force, not just conscripts
- 2. Civilian + Agency integration
 - RMPS, RMFR, ANSA, RCD can call on PDF support instantly
 - Keeps professional forces from being overwhelmed
- 3. Civic empowerment
 - Citizens know what to do before, during, and after crises
 - Reduces panic and chaos
- 4. Layered legal oversight
 - Constabulary + LHAP ensures PDF use is proportional and lawful

1. THE CONSTABULARY

“The Oversight Authority.”

The Constabulary is the supreme internal watchdog and regulator of ALL Roskarnian agencies.

Functions:

- Enforces discipline, legality, and operational standards

- Can investigate ANY agency
- Has authority to remove command officers for misconduct
- Deploys Constabulary Intervention Teams (CIT) during failures
- Conducts audits, inspections, and emergency compliance checks

Powers:

- Can seize command of ANY operation temporarily
- Can shut down corrupt or incompetent divisions
- Can charge personnel in military, police, fire, naval, or aerospace agencies

Divisions:

1. Internal Affairs Bureau (IAB)

- Role: Active Counter-Corruption & Surveillance.
- Purpose: Uncovers treason, bribery, and deep-seated misconduct within all military and civilian agencies.
- Actions: Runs wiretaps on high-ranking officials, plants undercover agents in corrupt squads, and interrogates suspected personnel.

2. Strategic Oversight Division (SOD)

- Role: Institutional Auditing & Process Analysis.
- Purpose: Ensures every agency meets Roskarnia's legal protocols and operational regulations.
- Actions: Conducts surprise midnight audits of weapon armories, reviews top-secret military operational logs, and flags command negligence.

3. Compliance Enforcement Corps (CEC)

- Role: Direct Intervention & Operational Enforcement.
- Purpose: Manages the active, field-level shutdown of failing or non-compliant divisions.
- Actions: Physically locks down compromised military bases or police stations, seizes evidence archives, and detains resisting officers.

Sub-Unit: Constabulary Intervention Team (CIT)

- Role: Emergency Field Command & Tactical Override.

- Purpose: Deploys directly into active hot zones when an agency suffers a catastrophic operational or moral failure.
- Actions: Temporarily strips local commanders of their authority, takes direct tactical control of ongoing battles or crises, and forcefully restores order.

4. High Command Tribunal (HCT)

- Role: Judicial Prosecution & Command Stripping.
- Purpose: Legally processes charges against corrupt personnel and permanently strips officers of rank.
- Actions: Convenes emergency courts-martial, issues immediate arrest warrants for Generals or Chiefs, and enacts permanent division shutdowns.

Standard Operating Protocol: "

When a CIT overrides an active military or police operation, they use a strict, aggressive protocol to establish dominance:

1. The Declaration: CIT broadcasts a secure, overriding command signal: *"Aegis Control, this is Constabulary Command. We are exercising supreme authority. Stand down your officers."*
2. The Lockdown: CIT operators arrive via specialized black vehicles, immediately taking physical custody of the command, radio channels, and intelligence feeds.
3. The Purge: Incompetent or corrupt leaders are physically removed from the scene in handcuffs, and the CIT Commander takes over the operation until the crisis ends.

2. PUBLIC DEFENSE FORCE (PDF)

"Every Citizen is a Protector."

Membership:

All Roskarnians aged 18–50 are automatically part of the PDF Reserve. All Public Force (All included) is also considered PDF and also supports PDF members such as reserves and civilians

Purpose:

- Disaster response

- Civil defense
- Mass evacuation
- National reserve manpower
- Support to RMPS, RMFR, and AFR during crises

Mandatory Monthly Training Includes:

- Basic firearms discipline (Voluntary)
- Firearms discipline = safety & handling for most, live fire for sub-units
- Rescue techniques (Voluntary)
- Fire suppression
- Evacuation & crowd management (Voluntary)
- First aid & trauma
- Urban defense (Voluntary)
- Emergency communication
- Basic Life skills

Sub-Units:

- PDF Civil Guard
- PDF Tactical Reserve

3. RMPS – ROSKARNIAN METROPOLITAN POLICE SERVICE

“Liberty, Equality, Fraternity.”

National police with full jurisdiction.

RMPS Operational Functions

- Crime Suppression

The proactive mitigation and elimination of criminal enterprise, illicit trade networks, and civil infractions. The Service utilizes continuous data-driven profiling and routine sector patrols to dismantle black-market distributions, fraud, and organized crime syndicates before they disrupt localized infrastructure stability and the safety of Roskarnia.

- Riot Control

The rapid pacification and dispersal of unlawful assemblies, and civil disturbances,. Operational doctrines dictates a strategy of immediate geometric containment; units deploy tactical cordons and non-lethal, high-impact dispersion assets to fragment crowds, isolating the leader rather than all perpetrators within specific structural corridors to prevent multi-sector escalation and unnecessary panic among the rioters.

- Counterterror

The strategic prevention, detection, and neutralization of domestic insurgency, high-yield sabotage, and asymmetric threats against the state. This function mandates continuous intelligence integration, the execution of high-risk tactical interdictions, and the deployment of specialized assault elements to secure critical national infrastructure and high-density population nodes.

- Highway & Border Policing

The enforcement of state sovereignty and regulatory compliance across all domestic transit networks, international logistics channels, and border checkpoints. Officers regulate the flow of automated freight, high-speed rail networks, and low-altitude corridors to prevent smuggling, intercept unregistered transport assets, and verify trans-sector travel manifests.

- City-Wide Safety Enforcement

The systematic maintenance of public order, municipal code adherence, and civic discipline throughout the urban grid. This function encompasses the routine inspection of structural compliance, the management of localized transit flow, and the execution of spot biometric verifications, backed by the authority to issue immediate administrative penalties and systemic utility or digital credit restrictions.

Elite Units:

- Counterterror Command (CTC)

- Role: High-Threat Prevention & Tactical Response.

- Purpose: Neutralizes active terrorist threats, bombings, and complex mass-casualty attacks.
- Actions: Conducts intelligence-led raids, disarms explosives, and deploys heavily armed tactical assault teams.

Rapid Response Group (RRG)

- Role: Emergency Tactical Deployment & Riot Control.
- Purpose: Restores public order during civil unrest and provides immediate backup to patrol officers.
- Actions: Manages crowd control, barricades active shooters, and executes high-risk warrant arrests.

Major Crimes Bureau (MCB)

- Role: High-Profile Investigation & Organized Crime Takedown.
- Purpose: Solves complex, large-scale crimes that require deep investigative resources.
- Actions: Tracks down serial offenders, dismantles human trafficking rings, and builds cases against syndicates

Hostage Rescue Team (HRT)

- Role: Precision Negotiation & Tactical Extraction.
- Purpose: Resolves barricaded suspect incidents and frees captives under extreme duress.
- Actions: Deploys sniper-observers, utilizes specialized breach gear, and coordinates crisis negotiators.

Maritime Police & Port Security (MPPS)

- Role: Waterborne Enforcement & Coastal Intercept.
- Purpose: Monitors waterways, ports, and rivers for illegal activity.
- Actions:* Utilizes patrol boats, conducts inspections of maritime vessels, and coordinates with coastal authorities.

Cyber Warfare & Digital Forensics Unit (CWDF)

- Role: High-Tech Investigation & Infrastructure Defense.
 - Purpose: Neutralizes ransomware attacks, dark web markets, and state-sponsored hacking.
 - Actions: Traces crypto transactions, recovers deleted data, and hunts down digital extortionists.

4. RMFR – ROSKARNIAN METROPOLITAN FIRE & RESCUE

Against all odds, we break the hellfire.

The Unified Response Creed between RMFR and RUERS

- RMFR: “Against all odds, we break the hellfire...”
- RUERS: “...so long as there is a heartbeat left to save.”

Roles:

- Structural firefighting
- Wildfire response
- HAZMAT
- Urban Search & Rescue
- Disaster management

Special Units:

4. Elite Units (Fire & Rescue)

Black Helmet Division

- Role: Extreme Hazard & High-Risk Fire Suppression.
- Purpose: Combats ultra-dangerous fires in complex environments like oil refineries, chemical plants, and nuclear facilities.
- Actions: Enters toxic atmospheric zones, operates heavily armored fire-suppression vehicles, and neutralizes industrial flash fires.

Aerial Fire Command (AFC)

- Role: Airborne Fire Suppression & Tactical Air Drops.
- Purpose: Coordinates with NRAF/ANSA aircraft to contain massive wildfires and high-rise infernos from above.
- Actions: Directs heavy water-bombers, manages retardant drop lines, and air-drops elite helitack crews into isolated zones.

Helitack Airborne Assault Force (HAAF)

- Role: Rapid Aerial Insertion & Wildland-Urban Interface Firefighting.
- Purpose: Inserts elite firefighters via fast-rope into unreachable terrain, active disaster zones, or burning structures ahead of ground crews [1].
- Actions: Fast-ropes from heavy helicopters directly onto building roofs or forest clearings, chainsaws emergency firebreaks, and directs aerial water drops from the ground. This unit utilizes CO2 (Carbon Dioxide) Extinguishers: and Dry Chemical (Monoammonium Phosphate) Extinguishers for extinguishing fires. They would be then extracted by going up the ropes using Tactical Rope Climbing via helicopter.

Urban Collapse Rescue Team (UCRT)

- Role: Heavy Structural Collapse & USAR (Urban Search and Rescue).
- Purpose: Extracts survivors trapped under collapsed buildings caused by earthquakes, bombings, or structural failures.
- Actions: Utilizes acoustic listening devices, and Heat imaging sensors that cuts through reinforced concrete, and stabilizes compromised structures to create rescue tunnels.

Maritime Firefighting & Salvage Unit

- Role: Shipboard Fire Suppression & Open-Water Rescue.
- Purpose: Combats fires on burning military warships, oil tankers, and cargo docks.
- Actions: Operates heavy fireboats with high-output foam cannons, boards burning vessels at sea, and prevents environmental oil spills.

Hazardous Materials Response Team (HMRT)

- Role: Chemical, Biological, and Radiological Mitigation.
- Purpose: Responds to toxic spills, industrial chemical leaks, and weaponized contamination events.
- Actions: Sets up decontamination corridors, plugs leaking industrial tanks, and uses advanced air-monitoring sensors.

RMFR Tactical Directive: "Hydraulic Assault" (Fire CQB)

In the Republic of Roskarnia, fire is not treated as a natural disaster it is treated as a hostile combatant occupying sovereign infrastructure. To ensure the survival of Roskarnian Citizens, the RMFR utilizes "Offensive Suppression" in extreme urban fires.

The "Life-Critical" Trigger

The Hydraulic Assault is essentially the "Break Glass in Case of Emergency" protocol. The RMFR uses standard, safer firefighting methods for most calls, watering it down from a distance, containing the perimeter, and using external monitors.

Phase I: Dynamic Entry & Breaching

- The Stack: Firefighters wearing specialized suits that can withstand heat and fire, gasmasks) form a tactical "stack" at the primary threshold.

- Breaching: High-energy hydraulic tools or specialized charges are used to neutralize the door/barrier. Speed is critical to prevent "flashover" while the team is in the fatal funnel.

Phase II: The Charge

- Shield Deployment: The Point Man carries a reinforced, transparent heat-shield (Grade-8 Thermal Composite). This shield deflects radiant heat and protects the team from structural debris.

- Thermal Aggression: The team does not take cover; they move toward the base of the fire in a controlled, aggressive stride.

Phase III: Kinetic Neutralization

- High-Pressure Suppression: Instead of traditional "spraying," the Lead Nozzleman uses a high-pressure, high-velocity stream (connected in a fire engine) aimed at the base of the thermal signature.

- CQB Engagement: The water is used as a kinetic hammer to physically break the chemical bond of the fire. The goal is to "suffocate" the heat through sheer force, clearing the room meter-by-meter just like clearing an insurgent cell.

Phase IV: Extraction & Recovery

- Once the thermal threat is dropped to "AMBER" levels, the Medics enter the secured "corridor" created by the shield-wall to extract civilians.


The Kinetic Reality: Water as a Weapon

In Phase III: Kinetic Neutralization, the RMFR utilizes the "Stinger" and high-pressure nozzle systems connected to the engine's pump.

- The Medium: It is still water, but it's often a "Heavy Mist" or a "Solid Stream" pressurized to such a degree that the water molecules act as a kinetic hammer.

- The Action: The nozzleman isn't just wetting the room. They are aiming for the "Thermal Heart." The pressure is so high that the water physically displaces the oxygen and breaks the fire's connection to the fuel source (the furniture, the walls, etc.) through sheer impact.

- The Goal: To "suffocate" the fire through force, clearing the room meter-by-meter just like an RMPS Counterterror team clears a room of hostiles.

 The "Shield-Wall" Approach

While the nozzleman provides the Kinetic Neutralization, the rest of the team relies on the Grade-8 Thermal Composite shields.

- Why the shield? In a standard fire department, you crawl low to avoid heat. In the RMFR, you stand and advance. The shield allows the "Point Man" to deflect the radiant heat and flames, creating a "Safe Corridor" directly behind him.
- The Result: This allows the team to reach the seat of the fire much faster than traditional methods, which is vital for protecting the expensive limestone and high-tech infrastructure of a \$25 trillion city.

5. ANSA – AEROSPACE & NAVAL SECURITY AUTHORITY

“Guardians of Sea & Sky.”

Not military.

This is Roskarnia’s coast guard + aviation security.

Tasks:

- Protect seaports & airports
- Maritime patrol
- Anti-smuggling
- Anti-piracy
- Sea-border defense
- Aviation incident handling

Sub-Forces:

1. Maritime Patrol & Interdiction Fleet (MPIF)

- Role: Open-Ocean Patrol & Sea-Border Defense.
- Purpose: Enforces Roskarnia's maritime borders, detains illegal entry vessels, and patrols economic zones.
- Actions: Operates medium-endurance cutters, launches drone surveillance over sea lanes, and intercepts unauthorized ships entering territorial waters.

2. Tactical Air Security Command (TASC)

- Role: Airport Defense & Aviation Incident Handling.
- Purpose: Secures international airport perimeters, handles hijacked aircraft scenarios, and manages major terminal breaches.
- Actions: Deploys counter-sniper teams to runways, executes aircraft tactical boarding, and manages airport lockdown protocols.

3. Coastal & Port Interception Squadron (CPIS)

- Role: Anti-Smuggling, Anti-Piracy, & Harbor Security.
- Purpose: Prevents contraband, weapons, and human trafficking from breaching Roskarnia's commercial shipping ports.
- Actions: Boards suspicious container ships, runs armed RHIB patrols around civilian docks, and conducts cargo profile inspections.

4. Airborne Search & Reconnaissance Wing (ASRW)

- Role: Long-Range Maritime Surveillance & Aviation Tracking.
- Purpose: Detects smuggling planes, tracks pirate vessels, and spots maritime disasters from the sky.
- Actions: Flies fixed-wing patrol planes, coordinates with Aerial Fire Command during offshore emergencies, and drops life rafts to stranded vessels.

6. AFR – ARMED FORCES OF ROSKARNIA

“The Strength of Our Nation.”

The main military.

Branches:

Mechanized Infantry Corps (MIC)

2nd Armored Regiment

- Role: Heavy Breakthrough & Armored Dominance.
- Purpose: Smashes through fortified enemy lines using maximum firepower and heavy armor protection.
- Actions: Commands Roskarnia's Main Battle Tanks (MBTs), engages enemy armor in direct tank-on-tank combat, and provides a mobile protective shield for advancing infantry.

9th Mechanized Transport Battalion

- Role: Rapid Armored Infantry Mobility.

- Purpose: Safely transports infantry squads across active, shrapnel-torn battlefields under heavy fire.
- Actions: Operates wheeled and tracked Armored Personnel Carriers (APCs), uses mounted heavy machine guns to suppress enemy positions, and quickly evacuates wounded troops under armor protection.

5th Attack Helicopter Squadron

- Role: Close Air Support & Tank Hunting.
- Purpose: Destroys enemy armored columns from the air and provides immediate, devastating firepower to ground forces.
- Actions: Flies heavily armed attack helicopters, fires laser-guided anti-tank missiles, and shreds enemy infantry cover with nose-mounted autocannons.

11th Tactical Combat Aviation Wing

- Role: Heliborne Troop Transport & Battlefield Logistics.
- Purpose: Flies troops, supplies, and light vehicles directly into hot zones to support ongoing ground battles.
- Actions: Operates heavy-lift and medium utility transport helicopters, conducts tactical air-assault insertions, and sling-loads artillery pieces across difficult terrain.

1st Expeditionary Mechanized Division

- Role: Armor, Heavy Assault, and Territorial Dominance.
- Purpose: Spearheads land-based offensive operations and defends Roskarnia's main land borders from physical invasion.
- Actions: Deploys main battle tanks, maneuvers armored infantry fighting vehicles (IFVs), and secures strategic terrain.

Strategic Missile Corps (SMC)

Long-Range Ballistic Command

- Role: Nuclear and Conventional Strategic Deterrence.
- Purpose: Maintains and operates Roskarnia's Intercontinental Ballistic Missiles (ICBMs) to prevent total war.
- Actions: Secures hardened underground missile silos, verifies launch keys under direct order of high command, and maintains strategic readiness.

Mobile Coastal & Tactical Strike Regiment

- Role: Rapid Precision Bombardment and Coastal Denying.
- Purpose: Works alongside the Coastline Protection Division to obliterate enemy ships and land forces approaching Roskarnia.

- Actions: Deploys mobile, truck-mounted hypersonic missile launchers along coastlines and hides launch vehicles in deep jungle or mountainous terrain.
- 8th Field Artillery Regiment
- Role: Conventional Tactical Fire Support.
- Purpose: Provides immediate, devastating long-range bombardment to suppress enemy positions ahead of infantry advances.
- Actions: Fires heavy 155mm towed and self-propelled howitzers, deploys smoke screens to mask friendly troop movements, and executes precise counter-battery fire against enemy artillery.

101st Mobile Tactical Missile Battery

- Role: Deployable Theater Ballistic Strike.
- Purpose: Deploys highly mobile, truck-mounted missile units to strike deep behind enemy lines, targeting hostile command centers, supply hubs, and airfields.
- Actions: Transits heavy Transporter-Erector-Launcher (TEL) vehicles through rugged terrain, sets up rapid camouflage concealment, and launches precision-guided tactical ballistic missiles before immediately relocating ("shoot-and-scoot").

12th Coastal Defense Artillery Command

- Role: Anti-Ship Shore Bombardment.
- Purpose: Coordinates with the Coastline Protection Division to completely deny enemy fleets access to Roskarnia's littoral waters.
- Actions: Operates shore-based, heavy rocket artillery systems and land-based cruise missile batteries to intercept and sink hostile warships approaching the coast.

Electronic Warfare & Signal Interdiction Group (EWSIG)

- Role: Tactical Military Disruption & Radar Jamming.
- Purpose: Blind and deafen enemy military-only combat assets to protect Roskarnian troops on the battlefield.
- Actions: Jam enemy battlefield radios, intercept tactical military data streams, and spoof incoming missile guidance systems to force them off-target.

Autonomous Strike Squadron (ASS)

- Role: Precision Aerial Interdiction & Reconnaissance.
- Purpose: Deploys unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) and "kamikaze" drones to take out high-value tactical military targets with zero risk to Roskarnian pilots.
- Actions: Operates long-endurance stealth drones, conducts laser-targeting for the Strategic Missile Corps, and deploys swarms of loitering munitions to neutralize enemy artillery.

Roskarnian Territorial Combat Group(RTCG)

14th Urban Combat & Security Battalion

- Role: City Warfare & Close-Quarters Combat.
- Purpose: Clears, secures, and defends Roskarnia's major coastal cities, ports, and industrial zones.
- Actions: Executes room-by-room building clearances, establishes fortified checkpoints on city streets, and combats urban guerrilla forces.

2nd Anti-Armor & Heavy Weapons Company

- Role: Tactical Vehicle Hunting & Fire Support.
- Purpose: Embedded within standard infantry lines to obliterate enemy tanks and low-flying aircraft.
- Actions: Fires shoulder-launched guided missiles, mans heavy machine-gun nests, and deploys automatic grenade launchers to suppress enemy advances.

3rd Mechanized Infantry Battalion

- Role: Armored Frontline Infantry.
- Purpose: Fights alongside main battle tanks to smash through enemy lines and capture hostile territory.
- Actions: Rides into battle inside heavily armed Infantry Fighting Vehicles (IFVs), dismounts to clear trenches, and holds forward positions against counter-attacks.

5th Light Infantry Regiment

- Role: Terrain-Specialized Foot Soldiers.
 - Purpose: Deploys to dense jungles, rugged mountains, or swamps where heavy vehicles and tanks cannot physically go.
 - Actions: Conducts long-range foot patrols, sets up devastating ambushes in heavy cover, and uses camouflage to blend seamlessly into the natural environment.
- FSR — Foreign Service Regiment

7. **NRAF – NATIONAL ROSKARNIAN AIRFORCE**

“Dominating our skies.”

This is the standard Airforce, handling all normal military aviation.

Duties:

- Air superiority

- Air defense
- Ground attack
- Reconnaissance
- Strategic transport
- UAV operations
- Support to ground troops

Main Wings:

- Fighter Wing
- Bomber Wing
- Air Defense Wing
- Recon/Surveillance Wing
- Transport Wing
- Drone Command

Works with:

- RAC (space-level protection)
- ANSA (civil aviation security)
- AFR (joint ops)

8. RAC – ROSKARNIAN AEROSPACE COMMAND

“Infinity and Beyond.”

Not a normal airforce.

This handles space, orbital, and exo-atmospheric warfare.

Mission:

- Control satellites

- Anti-satellite defense
- Orbital weapon systems
- Intercept ballistic missiles & hypersonics
- Operate exo-jets and high-altitude aircraft
- Space surveillance

Assets:

- Orbital Defense Network
- ExoJet Fleet
- Space-Based Radar Arrays
- Anti-Kinetic Satellite Interceptors

RAC = Space + near-space dominance

NRAF = Normal sky dominance

9. RSO – ROSKARNIAN SPECIAL OPERATIONS

“The Dagger of Roskarnia.”

The elite special forces.

Units:

1. Nightshade Group

- Role: Deep Covert Operations & Asymmetric Sabotage.
- Purpose: Eliminates high-value threats and destabilizes enemy assets behind enemy lines with zero deniability.
- Actions: Conducts low-profile assassinations, implants untraceable sleeper agents, and sabotages foreign military manufacturing plants under total radio silence.

2. Vanguard Team

- Role: High-Intensity Quick-Strike Assault.

- Purpose: Acts as the tip of the spear to punch through heavily fortified positions and seize critical strategic points within minutes.
- Actions: Executes dynamic air-assault entries via transport helicopters, smashes fortified enemy command bunkers, and holds key bridges or extraction points until the main Army arrives.

3. ARES Division

- Role: Tier-1 Hostage Rescue & Counterterrorism.
- Purpose: Resolves maximum-security hostage situations and executes precision takedowns of terrorist networks.
- Actions: Breaches hijacked buildings or naval ships, deploys precision sniper-observer teams, and coordinates with ANSA and the MSRU for maritime hostage extractions.

4. Shadow Rangers

- Role: Long-Range Reconnaissance & Target Acquisition.
- Purpose: Infiltrates harsh, hostile terrain to map enemy troop movements and paint targets for heavy artillery.
- Actions: Operates deeply concealed observation posts for weeks, navigates jungle or mountainous border zones on foot, and relays precise targeting lasers to the Strategic Missile Corps.

5. Ghost Unit

- Role: Cyber-Physical Warfare & Intelligence Strikes.
- Purpose: Blends field espionage with tactical digital hacking to blind enemy defenses right before a physical attack.
- Actions: Physically infiltrates enemy server rooms to plant malware, taps foreign communication lines, and hijacks enemy battlefield drones mid-operation

Reports directly to:

- Leader of Roskarnia
- AFR High Command
- Constabulary (oversight only)

10. RICEA – ROSKARNIAN IMMIGRATION AND CUSTOMS ENFORCEMENT AGENCY

“Safeguarding our nation .”

Purpose:

- Control all national borders, airports, seaports, and immigration points.
- Enforce customs regulations and prevent illegal trafficking.
- Collaborate with RMPS, ANSA, and RCD for national security.

Functions:

- Immigration processing and visa enforcement.

Reporting & Oversight:

- Reports to Constabulary for compliance and operational review.
- Coordinates with RCD Peacekeepers for international border operations when necessary.
- Integrated with RSO units for covert interdiction or special missions.

11. RCD — ROSKARNIAN CIVIL DEFENSE

(Military Police / Peacekeepers)

“Protecting each one of us, regardless of race, color, or belief.”

The Roskarnian Civil Defense (RCD) is a constitutionally mandated national force responsible for the protection of civilians, the enforcement of lawful order during extraordinary conditions, and the stabilization of environments affected by crisis, conflict, or disaster. The RCD operates

at the intersection of civil authority and disciplined force, ensuring that security is maintained without the erosion of humanity, legality, or dignity.

The RCD is not a conventional police service nor a standing combat army. It is a hybrid civil-defense and peacekeeping institution, designed to operate where ordinary law enforcement is insufficient and where military deployment would be excessive or inappropriate.

Core Purpose

- Acts as military police, peacekeepers, and rapid civil response units
- Protects Roskarnian citizens, interests, and lawful persons domestically and internationally-with cooperation with local forces and operates in nations with consent from the government from as said nation.
- Maintains public order during:
 - States of emergency
 - Civil unrest
 - Natural and technological disasters
 - Armed stabilization or peacekeeping deployments
- Serves as the primary stabilizing force between civilian life and armed conflict

The RCD exists to ensure that order is restored quickly, proportionally, and lawfully, with civilian protection as its highest mandate.

Strategic Functions

- Crowd control and large-scale population management
- Mass evacuation coordination across urban, rural, and cross-border environments
- Protection of critical infrastructure, humanitarian corridors, and safe zones
- Armed peacekeeping operations both within Roskarnia and abroad, in cooperation with:
 - Allied states
 - International coalitions

- United Nations or UN-mandated missions
- Enforcement of lawful directives issued by:
 - PDF
 - RMPS
 - RMFR
 - ANSA
 - RICEA

When deployed outside Roskarnian territory,

RCD:

- Respects host-nation sovereignty
- Operates under local law, international law, and rules of engagement agreed upon diplomatically
- Prioritizes civilian safety and de-escalation above all tactical objectives

Operational Scope

- Domestic crisis stabilization and disaster response
- Border-area and overseas citizen protection
- Peace enforcement and ceasefire monitoring
- Emergency law enforcement augmentation
- Humanitarian security and aid escort
- High-risk evacuation of civilians from conflict zones

The RCD may operate independently or jointly with AFR, PDF, or allied forces depending on mission classification.

Special Units

1. Tactical Rapid Intervention Unit (TRIU)

- Role: High-Risk Stabilization & Crisis Interdiction.
- Purpose: Restores public safety when massive civilian panic, disasters, or asymmetric threats overwhelm standard police.
- Actions:
 - Deploys via rapid air-transport to secure collapsed urban sectors during major emergencies.
 - Establishes heavily fortified "Safe Havens" inside cities to shield fleeing civilians from active violence or unrest.
 - Acts as Roskarnia's elite deployment contribution to international peacekeeping missions under global mandate.

2. Urban & Rural Evacuation Task Forces (URETF)

- Role: Mass Displacement Control & Corridor Management.
- Purpose: Systematically clears entire populations out of active war zones or natural disaster sectors without gridlock.
- Actions:
 - Secures and sanitizes major transit highways, rail lines, and airports to keep civilian escape routes free of threats.
 - Deploys advanced logistical routing to optimize the flow of thousands of vehicles and pedestrians simultaneously.
 - Sets up mobile screening points to prevent hostile actors from hiding within civilian refugee columns.

3. Emergency Logistics & Support Corps (ELSC)

- Role: Humanitarian Supply Chain & Critical Reconstruction.
- Purpose: Keeps populations alive post-disaster and rapidly reconnects broken infrastructure to prevent total societal collapse.
- Actions:
 - Coordinates massive field-kitchen networks, water purification grids, and temporary tent cities for displaced populations.
 - Runs heavily armed supply convoys to deliver specialized medicine, blood plasma, and rations directly into high-risk areas.
 - Deploys rapid-engineering squads to repair power grids, fix main bridges, and clear roads so emergency services can move.

4. Peacekeeping Liaison Division (PLD)

- Role: Diplomatic Synchronization & Civil-Military Interface.

- Purpose: Ensures the RCD can operate flawlessly alongside foreign military allies, the UN, and international NGOs.
- Actions:
 - Deploys embedded diplomatic officers to coordinate border crossings and international humanitarian aid drops.
 - Negotiates localized, temporary ceasefires on the ground to allow the Evacuation Task Force to safely move civilians.
 - Manages the data-sharing network between the military (AFR), civilian border security (ANSA), and international aid agencies

Authority & Legal Status

- Operates under direct constitutional authority and Supreme Leader directives
- Fully armed and equipped for:
 - Civil defense
 - Stabilization operations
 - Limited combat scenarios strictly tied to civilian protection
- Authorized to detain, secure, and control individuals only within lawful operational mandates
- No authority to suspend constitutional rights without explicit legal activation

Oversight & Accountability

- Subject to full Constabulary oversight, inspection, and investigation
- All operations reviewed for:
 - Legality
 - Proportionality
 - Necessity
 - Humanity
- Coordinated operationally with:
 - PDF

- RMPS
 - RMFR
 - ANSA

- Any abuse of authority constitutes a serious constitutional offense

Doctrine Statement

The Roskarnian Civil Defense exists to hold the line between chaos and civilization. It is neither conqueror nor oppressor, but guardian and stabilizer. Wherever civilians are threatened, order collapses, or peace must be enforced, the RCD stands present — disciplined, lawful, and unwavering.

12. **ROSKARNIAN INTELLIGENCE SERVICE (RIS)**

“To Know, To Act, To Protect.”

The Roskarnian Intelligence Service (RIS) is the primary intelligence, counter-espionage, and national threat assessment agency of Roskarnia. RIS operates to prevent threats before they materialize, safeguarding national stability, citizens, and sovereign interests at home and abroad. RIS is operational, but non-military, and functions under strict oversight to prevent abuse of power.

Functions:

- Detect and neutralize espionage and foreign intelligence activity
- Prevent internal sabotage, subversion, and organized destabilization
- Provide strategic intelligence to national leadership
- Protect critical institutions, infrastructure, and state continuity
- Domestic and foreign intelligence collection
- Counter-espionage and counter-intelligence operations
- Threat monitoring (political, economic, cyber, security)
- Strategic risk forecasting and early-warning assessments

- Intelligence support to PDF, RCD, RMPS, AFR, and ANSA
- Identification of hostile influence, disinformation, and covert interference

Powers:

- Conduct lawful surveillance under national security mandate
- Monitor and disrupt hostile intelligence networks
- Detain and interrogate foreign agents and non-citizen hostile actors
- Coordinate neutralization of confirmed external threats
- Request operational support from RCD, RSO, or AFR when required
- Engage in intelligence-sharing with approved international partners

Operational Boundaries:

- No mass arrest authority
- No crowd-control or public-order enforcement
- No independent military action
- No authority to suspend constitutional rights
- No unilateral lethal authority

All actions must be threat-specific, targeted, and documented.

Oversight & Accountability:

- Subject to Constabulary investigation and compliance review
- Reviewed under LHAP standards for legality and humanity
- Mandatory internal audit of all high-risk operations
- Abuse of intelligence authority constitutes a serious criminal offense

Divisions:

1. Foreign Intelligence Directorate (FID)

- Role: Global Espionage & External Human Intelligence (HUMINT).

- Purpose: Gathers critical political, economic, and military intelligence outside Roskarnia's borders to give national leadership early warnings.
- Actions:
 - Deploys deep-cover intelligence officers and manages secret informant networks inside foreign governments or hostile organizations.
 - Conducts covert operations abroad to photograph enemy military builds or intercept classified foreign documents.
 - Coordinates with approved international spy agencies to trace global black-market weapons shipments heading toward Roskarnian waters.

2. Domestic Counter-Espionage Bureau (DCEB)

- Role: Hunting Foreign Spies & Preventing Subversion.
- Purpose: Detects, tracks, and completely neutralizes foreign intelligence agents trying to steal Roskarnian secrets or sabotage infrastructure.
- Actions:
 - Runs targeted surveillance on suspected foreign diplomats, moles, or corporate spies trying to infiltrate the Strategic Missile Corps.
 - Conducts low-profile stings to catch traitors passing state secrets to adversarial nations.
 - Detains and interrogates captured foreign operatives under strict legal and humane guidelines.

3. Cyber & Signals Intelligence Division (CSID)

- Role: Electronic Eavesdropping & Digital Reconnaissance (SIGINT).
- Purpose: Monitors global and domestic digital threats, communications, and data networks to intercept hostile plans before they happen.
- Actions:
 - Intercepts and decrypts foreign military satellite communications, radio traffic, and dark web coordination.
 - Tracks the digital infrastructure used by hostile states to launch disinformation campaigns targeting Roskarnian elections or public trust.
 - Works alongside the military's Cyberwarfare Command to identify foreign zero-day exploits before they can hit civilian infrastructure.

4. Strategic Analysis & Forecasting Office (SAFO)

- Role: Threat Assessment & Early-Warning Reporting.
- Purpose: Synthesizes massive amounts of raw spy data into clear, actionable intelligence reports for the High Command.
- Actions:

- Produces the *Daily National Threat Assessment* mapping out political, economic, and security risks to the nation.
- Utilizes advanced data modeling to forecast potential food shortages, resource conflicts, or foreign military invasions years in advance.
- Evaluates the stability of foreign regimes to predict how geopolitical shifts will impact Roskarnia's trade routes and naval safety.

5. Covert Threat Disruption Unit (CTDU)

- Role: Operational Neutralization & Active Threat Fracturing.
- Purpose: Lawfully disrupts, misleads, and breaks up hostile intelligence networks without resorting to mass arrests or unilateral lethal force.
- Actions:
 - Feeds "double agents" targeted disinformation to completely ruin a foreign spy network's operational plans.
 - Executes legal asset freezes and digital lockdowns of front companies funding domestic subversion.
 - When physical force is needed to stop a threat, they trigger the protocol to request immediate tactical backup from the RSO (Special Operations) or the Army.

6. Intelligence Integrity & Compliance Office (IICO)

- Role: Internal Legal Watchdog & Auditing.
- Purpose: Ensures every wiretap, interrogation, and field operation stays strictly within the agency's operational boundaries to prevent abuse of power.
- Actions:
 - Reviews and archives every single warrant, targeted surveillance log, and interrogation tape for legal accountability.
 - Acts as the direct, mandatory liaison to The Constabulary, handing over internal documents for independent oversight reviews.
 - Investigates any internal allegations of RIS officers overstepping their authority or violating constitutional rights

Reporting Structure:

- Reports directly to the Supreme Leader for strategic intelligence
- Operational transparency to the Constabulary (oversight only)
- Coordinates with RCD for international and cross-border matters

- Provides intelligence briefings to AFR and national security bodies

Doctrine Statement:

RIS exists not to rule, not to intimidate, and not to police the public — but to ensure that threats to Roskarnia are identified early, contained quietly, and resolved lawfully.

13. ROSKARNIAN FOREIGN SERVICE REGIMENT (FSR)

“Service Beyond Borders.”

The Roskarnian Foreign Service Regiment (FSR) is a specialized auxiliary formation composed of vetted non-citizen volunteers and foreign nationals who lawfully enter service to the Republic of Roskarnia. The FSR exists to integrate foreign expertise, manpower, and international cooperation into Roskarnia’s defense, civil protection, and peacekeeping missions under strict national oversight.

The FSR is not a mercenary force and does not operate independently. It functions under Roskarnian command, law, and constitutional authority at all times.

Functions

- Provide auxiliary manpower for defense, civil defense, and peacekeeping operations
- Support PDF, RCD, AFR, and RMPS during large-scale emergencies
- Participate in humanitarian assistance, disaster relief, and evacuation missions
- Serve in international peacekeeping and stabilization deployments
- Act as cultural and linguistic liaison units during foreign operations
- Enhance interoperability with allied and partner nations
- Support infrastructure protection and logistics under supervision

Membership & Eligibility

- Open to foreign nationals aged 18–45
- Mandatory background screening by RIS and RICEA
- Psychological, medical, and security clearance required

- No prior military experience required, but assessed and categorized
- Dual loyalty or active foreign intelligence affiliation strictly prohibited

All members swear a Service Oath to the Constitution of Roskarnia, limited to duty, lawfulness, and civilian protection.

Powers

- Authorized to carry and operate equipment issued by Roskarnian command
- May perform defensive and peacekeeping duties when lawfully deployed
- May assist in evacuation, security, and humanitarian operations
- May operate under Rules of Engagement defined by LHAP and the Constabulary

Operational Boundaries

- No independent command authority
- No unilateral deployment or engagement
- No intelligence collection authority outside assigned missions
- No authority to conduct arrests without RCD or RMPS supervision
- No political or domestic law-making role

- Continuous monitoring by RIS for counter-intelligence integrity
- Violations of law or oath result in immediate suspension or removal

- Crimes committed are prosecuted under Roskarnian law

14. RUERS – ROSKARNIAN URBAN EMERGENCY RESPONSE SERVICE

“To go into hell, no matter the cost, so long as there is a heartbeat left to save.”

Against all odds, we break the hellfire.

The Unified Response Creed between RMFR and RUERS

- RMFR: “Against all odds, we break the hellfire...”
- RUERS: “...so long as there is a heartbeat left to save.”

The supreme agency for large-scale crisis management and mass population protection.

Functions:

- Mass Evacuation: Coordinating the rapid movement of entire districts or urban infrastructure during structural or environmental threats.

- Disaster Logistics: Managing the distribution of life-critical resources (air, water, medical) during sector-wide lockdowns.
- Social Flow Restoration: Overriding standard traffic and transit algorithms to create "Life-Corridors" for emergency transit.
- Atmospheric & NBC Protection: Monitoring and neutralizing chemical, biological, or nuclear threats within dense urban environments.
- Civil Defense Command: Serving as the central nervous system that integrates PDF, RMPS, and RMFR during a Level 5 National Emergency.

Elite Units:

1. Master Command (MC)

- Role: Urban Grid Control & Crisis Synchronization.
- Purpose: Serves as the central nervous system that merges civilian infrastructure data with military/police networks during Level 5 National Emergencies.
- Actions:
 - Overrides urban AI and smart-city grids to instantly create "Life-Corridors"(manipulating traffic lights, automated train paths, and drone lanes for emergency vehicles).
 - Assumes tactical command over local Police, Fire, and Civil Defense units in affected sectors to ensure a unified response.
 - Monitors real-time biometric feeds, structural sensors, and atmospheric monitors across the entire metropolis.

2. Bio-Hazard Containment Wing (BCW)

- Role: Urban CBRN Neutralization & Quarantine Control.
- Purpose: Detects, isolates, and scrubs hazardous chemical, biological, or nuclear contamination within dense, high-population environments.
- Actions:
 - Deploys heavy, automated decontamination misting vehicles into infected city streets or transit hubs.
 - Establishes hermetically sealed airlocks and pressure-controlled containment tents around contaminated "Bridge-Buildings."
 - Utilizes advanced autonomous sensors to map toxic plumes or radiation spread through city air currents.

3. Heavy Logistics Corps (HLC)

- Role: Mass Resource Supply & Survival Distribution.

- Purpose: Ensures millions of trapped or locked-down civilians receive life-critical resources (clean air, water, medicine, power) without panic.
- Actions:
 - Deploys massive, armored supply transport columns capable of pushing through debris-strewn urban streets.
 - Connects mobile oxygen-pumping arrays and clean-water filtration rigs directly into the life-support networks of sealed sectors.
 - Manages the rapid construction of high-capacity emergency field hospitals and temporary shelter hubs.

4. Structural Integrity Unit (SIU)

- Role: Megastructure Engineering & Collapse Mitigation.
- Purpose: Monitors, stabilizes, and clears complex engineering failures in vertical skyscrapers, underground tunnels, and interconnected mega-structures.
- Actions:
 - Uses acoustic sensors and heavy-duty robotic braces to stabilize shifting foundations or fractured support beams in massive buildings.
 - Calculates safe evacuation loads for massive sky-bridges to prevent catastrophic crowd-crush structural failures.
 - Deploys specialized technical breaching teams to cut rescue tunnels through reinforced concrete and steel to reach trapped populations

5. Multi-Domain Rescue & Extraction Force (MDREF)

- Role: All-Terrain Fire, Rescue, and Rapid Insertion.
- Purpose: Serves as RUERS's highly versatile, rapid-response spearhead capable of deploying via heavy fire trucks, armored utility vehicles, or fast-roping helicopters into any urban or industrial disaster zone.
- Actions:
 - Executes high-altitude heli-borne extractions from burning sky-bridges and high-rise rooftops.
 - Deploys via heavy-duty tactical fire trucks to handle complex vehicle pileups, structural collapses, and industrial flashpoints.
 - specialized cutting, extrication, and high-pressure suppression gear to stabilize hot zones ahead of regular crews.
 -

6. Urban Hazard Extraction Force (UHEF)

- Role: High-Risk Extreme Environment Penetration.
- Purpose: Deploys into near-suicidal, catastrophic zones (active structural collapses, flashover infernos, or toxic containment breaches) where survival limits are measured in

minutes, relying on elite training and specialized escape protocols to extract targets and survive.

- Actions:
 - Fast-ropes using helicopter or breaches directly into localized blast zones, blazing skyscraper cores, or compromised reactor levels to execute high-stakes rescues.
 - Utilizes rapid-anchoring winches, emergency personal descent systems, and ballistic breaching shields to dynamically escape collapsing structures or oncoming firewalls.
 - Secures volatile structural failures using ultra-dense pneumatic shoring tools, neutralizing immediate threats to ensure both civilian extraction and team survival
 -

7. Thermal Breaching & Technical Rescue Squadron (TBTRS)

- Role: High-Risk Structural Penetration & Flashover Survival.
- Purpose: Enters structurally compromised, high-heat, and toxic urban environments to extract trapped casualties right at the knife-edge of structural failure or total room flashover.
- Actions:
 - Fast-ropes onto skyscraper roofs or rolls up in heavy trucks to cut through reinforced steel doors, targeting the shortest path to trapped people.
 - Monitors real-time thermal data to predict a room flashover down to the exact second, executing the rescue and retreating before the room ignites.
 - Deploys high-pressure hydraulic shoring struts to instantly prop up sagging concrete ceilings, preventing the team and the victims from being crushed
 -

Operational Differentiation: UHEF vs. TBTRS

The core difference between the Urban Hazard Extraction Force (UHEF) and the Thermal Breaching & Technical Rescue Squadron (TBTRS) lies in versatility versus specialization, and speed versus engineering.

1. Threat Scope

- UHEF (Multi-Hazard): Deploys to unpredictable, multi-vector catastrophes. They handle compound disasters involving concurrent structural, chemical, and radiological hazards (e.g., reactor leaks or industrial blasts).
- TBTRS (Domain-Specific): Specializes strictly in structural fires and heavy collapses. They focus entirely on the physics of burning high-rises, subterranean transit failures, and intense thermal dynamics.

2. Tactical Methodology

- UHEF (Dynamic Mobility): Relies on speed, high-mobility insertion, and rapid evacuation. They use helicopter fast-ropes, ballistic shields, and personal rope-descent systems to grab targets and dive out before secondary explosions occur.
- TBTRS (Calculative Engineering): Relies on data, heavy breaching, and structural reinforcement. They use thermal telemetry to predict flashovers down to the second and deploy heavy hydraulic struts to physically stabilize collapsing ceilings.

3. Equipment Focus

- UHEF Gear: Lightweight, personal-survival assets. Includes multi-hazard protective suits, portable pneumatic tools, and individual winch systems that maximize squad agility.
- TBTRS Gear: Heavy mechanical extrication and environmental tools. Includes plasma cutters for reinforced structural steel, concrete listening devices, and high-output water-mist cooling shields.

Strategic Summary

The UHEF is the agile, high-speed task force sent to breach highly volatile, unpredictable disaster zones. The TBTRS is the heavy engineering squadron sent to systematically break through and stabilize massive structural collapses and intense thermal barriers.

15. RN — ROSKARNIAN NAVY

“Safeguarding our Sea”

This is Roskarnia’s Navy

Tasks:

- Protect Roskarnia
- Maritime patrol
- Sea-border defense

Main Combat Units:

- 1st Surface Action Group

Surface Action Group (SAG): A combat unit composed of several destroyers and cruisers tasked with seeking out and destroying enemy surface threats.

(1st SAG): Led by the R-Kazan Class Cruisers (120 VLS cells).

Carrier Strike Group (CSG): A massive armada centered around an aircraft carrier, escorted by a protective screen of destroyers and frigates. Total air superiority at sea, centered around our massive carriers.

- Expeditionary Strike Group (ESG):

Amphibious assault and coastal raiding.

- Surface Strike Group Alpha (SSG-A): High-speed offensive response.
- Maritime Guided-Missile Task Group (MGMTG): Long-range saturation strikes.

Specialized Sub-Forces:

1. Naval Security Wing (NSW)

- Role: Base Defense & Infrastructure Protection.
- Purpose: Guards military harbors, naval yards, and ammunition docks from sabotage.

- Sub-Maritime Crisis Response Wing (SMCRW): Deep-sea emergency and sabotage repair.

- Advanced Subsurface Strike Unit (ASSU): Nuclear-powered predator submarines.

- Subsurface Reconnaissance & Surveillance Group (SRSG): The "Eyes in the Deep" sensor network.

- MSRS (Primi ad Conscondendum) Squadron: The elite "First to Board" RHIB units for high-speed intercepts

16. REMS – ROSKARNIAN EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

“To Care, To Save, To Sustain.”

Purpose:

REMS is the primary public healthcare and frontline emergency medical service of Roskarnia. It manages the nation's everyday emergency ambulance fleets, paramedic response networks, and public trauma care. Unlike specialized tactical or military corps, REMS is the direct, civilian-facing lifeline that coordinates everyday emergency medical dispatch across all urban and rural sectors.

Functions:

- Frontline Emergency Response: Dispatches standard ambulances, rapid-response paramedic cars, and motorcycle medics to medical emergencies, accidents, and civilian trauma calls.
- Mass Triage & Transport: Manages the systemic transport of patients to municipal hospitals and coordinates field triage during localized multi-casualty incidents.
- Public Health Support: Coordinates with local communities to manage emergency blood drives, mobile clinics, and public life-support training.

Main Units:

- Metropolitan Ambulance Fleet (MAF)
 - Role: Frontline Urban Response & Basic Life Support.
 - Purpose: Provides standard medical emergency response across the urban grids and rural areas
 - Actions: Dispatches standard ambulances to homes, workplaces, and public spaces to treat and transport patients to state hospitals. Coordinates directly with local dispatch to handle everyday non-tactical medical crises and routine emergencies.
- Critical Care Transport Division (CCTD)
 - Role: Intensive Care Transit & Mobile Stabilization.
 - Purpose: Moves highly unstable patients between medical facilities safely.
 - Actions: Operates specialized, heavy-duty intensive-care ambulances staffed by senior flight-nurses and trauma physicians. Maintains continuous advanced life-support arrays mid-transit to keep critical patients stable during long-distance transfers.
- Rapid Transit Medical Unit (RTMU)

- Role: Gridlock Penetration & Rapid First Response.
- Purpose: Reaches patients minutes before a standard ambulance can arrive in dense urban environments.
- Actions: Utilizes motorcycle-mounted paramedics equipped with compact trauma kits and automated external defibrillators to weave through heavy city traffic. Establishes immediate on-scene triage and applies early life-saving interventions while heavy transport units are en route.

- Aeromedical Evacuation Wing (AEW)

- Role: Rapid Sky-Transit & Trauma Extraction.
- Purpose: Utilizes a massive fleet of high-speed medical helicopters to bypass urban gridlock and long rural distances.
- Actions: Responds to high-speed highway pileups, remote accidents, and urban rooftop medical emergencies, stabilizing patients mid-air with advanced life-support systems.

Flies critical patients directly to specialized trauma center helipads, cutting down transit times drastically.

- Aero-Trauma Insertion Squadron (ATIS)

- Role: Extreme Environment Penetration & Deep Rescue.
- Purpose: Deploys elite, specialized medical trauma teams directly into hard-to-reach, hostile, or isolated locations where helicopters cannot land.
- Actions: Fast-ropes or hoists high-tier trauma physicians and rescue medics directly onto burning sky-bridge roofs, deep mountain ravines, or structurally compromised urban areas. Performs immediate, high-stakes surgical stabilization on-scene under extreme conditions before hoisting the victims up for aerial extraction.
