Course Description: This course (#10-203-104) will cover capturing digital images, exposure, shutter speed, aperture, composition, camera operations, lenses, lighting, camera accessories, types of photography, photo challenges, importing, editing, and storing images. Access to a digital camera is required. DSLR is preferred, but point-and-shoot cameras will be accepted. * *College credits may count as a Humanities or Fine Arts credit at some colleges*
