A - Apples:

 Get enough apples for everyone in the class. Open your mouth and say A says /a/ then take a bite of your apple.

G - Glue Dots on G:

marker ✨ Each student will get a large letter G and a glue bottle. They will make glue dots all around the G as they say, G says /g/. When dry use your finger to trace over glue dots on 'G' to reinforce its shape.

I - I Spy Lowercase:

 A game to identify lowercase letter i.

J - Jumping Contest or Jingle Bells:

 Engage your students in a dynamic jumping contest to reinforce the 'J' sound. Place duct tape on the floor as a starting line. As you hold up a letter 'J' card, each student says "J says /j/" before jumping as far as they can. Focus on the fun of jumping rather than measuring distance. Additionally, if you're teaching the letter 'J' around the holiday season, introduce a crafty jingle bell activity. Shape a pipe cleaner into a 'J', attach a jingle bell, and have students say "J says /j/" followed by singing "Jingle Bells." This activity combines physical movement with musical fun, emphasizing the phonetic sound of the letter J in memorable ways.

K - Letter K Poem:

 Use a letter poem to teach the letter 'K'. Print a copy for each student and have them circle all of the letter K's in the poem.

M - Mud Writing:

 Dive into sensory learning with Mud Writing for the letter M. Give each student a plate with a scoop of chocolate pudding, playfully referred to as "mud." Encourage students to practice writing the letter 'M' in the mud, using their fingers. This engaging activity not only helps reinforce the shape and sound of the letter M but also enhances fine motor skills and sensory integration. By associating the letter with a fun and tactile experience, students are more likely to remember its formation and sound.

N - Noodle Necklace:

 For the letter N, engage your preschoolers in creating Noodle Necklaces. Before the activity, have students help paint rigatoni noodles in various colors, allowing them to dry overnight. During the activity, provide each child with a length of yarn or string and let them thread the colorful noodles onto it to create their own necklaces. This activity combines fine motor skill development with letter recognition as you emphasize the sound of 'N' while they work. Discuss other words that start with N as they string their noodles, making the connection between the letter and everyday objects. This craft not only reinforces the letter 'N' but also provides a tangible

artifact that students can wear and share, enhancing their pride in learning and creating.

Q - Q and U Stickers:

👉 Highlight the unique bond between the letters 'Q' and 'U' with a fun sticker activity. Provide each student with stickers labeled 'Q' and 'U'. Have them place the 'Q' sticker on one palm and the 'U' sticker on the other. Introduce the clapping poem: "Q and U, they stick like glue, they are never apart, this makes me very smart!" As they say the poem, students clap their hands together, symbolizing the connection between these two letters. This activity not only teaches letter recognition and phonics but also involves rhythmic movement and auditory learning, making it a multi-sensory experience that reinforces the concept of 'Q' always being followed by 'U' in words.

R - Rain Cloud:

 Create a learning station with a "Rain Cloud" setup on butcher paper, featuring a cloud and raindrops containing various letters. Have students identify and color in raindrops with the letter 'R', both uppercase and lowercase. This activity combines art with letter recognition, making learning about the letter 'R' visually engaging and interactive.

U - Fine Motor 'U':

 Dive into letter recognition with tactile activities for the letter 'U'. Provide each student with a printed letter 'U' and a

selection of mini manipulatives like erasers, magnetic bingo chips, or small objects. Encourage them to cover the outline of the letter, enhancing fine motor skills and letter familiarity through hands-on interaction. This method not only supports alphabet learning but also improves dexterity and hand-eye coordination.

V - Volcano Demonstration:

 Dive into the dynamic world of volcanoes with the letter 'V'. Craft a single large volcano out of playdough and let it dry. For the eruption, fill it with baking soda dyed red to simulate lava. During the activity, have students chant "V says /v/" as their cue to watch as you pour vinegar into the crater, causing a dramatic eruption. This vivid demonstration blends a lesson on the letter 'V' with a fun, visual experiment, making the sound and shape of 'V' unforgettable.

W - Weather Word Web or Water Writing:

 Combine literacy with environmental learning using the letter 'W'. Create a Weather Word Web on a large poster; students can lie on their stomachs and contribute words associated with weather. Alternatively, practice writing 'W' with water on a sidewalk or chalkboard.

X - X Marks the Spot:

 Engage with the letter 'X' using the alphabet artistry pack. Provide students with the letter X page, featuring a large central X. Students trace the large X, then use various colors to write additional X's surrounding it, reinforcing letter recognition and color usage. Finally, they cut out the letter along dotted lines, combining fine motor skills with literacy in a colorful, hands-on activity.
